**Car Of Corn To Be Loaded For Orphan Home**

Z. D. Barber, superintendent of the Boles Orphan Home at Quinlan, Texas, near Greenville, Texas, came in Sunday morning, in time to worship here, and preached that afternoon for the church at Johnson. A month or two ago, an agent of the home was here to see about making up a car of corn for the home, but at that time it was bad and little could be done about the matter.

Elder Barber preached a fine sermon at the church of Christ here Sunday night, and early Monday went back out in the Johnson and Gomez communities. Soon in the afternoon he came in and announced that the car was already made up, and that the brethren were waiting for a car to be put on the track. It will hold about 20 tons of corn, and we understand will be transported free by the Santa Fe and T. & P. railroads.

The land for this home was given some seven or eight years ago by an aged couple by the name of Boles, which consisted of several hundred acres of land and some fairly good improvements. Since that time, other buildings have been added, and they are caring for about 100 orphans, and with the exception of Tipton Orphan Home, is one of the largest institutions of the kind supported by the churches of Christ in the south-west.

It is said that this aged couple are the grandparents of John Boles of Hollywood movie fame.

**National Chief Of Legion To Be In Amarillo, Tex.**

Indianapolis, Ind., Feb.—One of the most important and largest meetings on the itinerary of Louis A. Johnson, national commander of the American Legion, is scheduled for Amarillo, Texas, March 17, it was announced at national headquarters here today following the definite acceptance by the national commander of the invitation to speak in Amarillo that night.

Correspondence with Texas Legion officials shows that Legionnaires will attend the meeting from Kansas, Oklahoma and New Mexico, as well as from a large section of Texas adjacent to Amarillo.

Publicity regarding the meeting is being sent into the other states as well as to Texas cities.

Tentative arrangements are for the National Commander to arrive in Amarillo possibly by airplane which he uses extensively in his travels. It also is the plan for him to be met on his arrival by the Amarillo School Cadet Corps and two drum and bugle corps. The arrival will probably be in the forenoon.

The commander will attend as guest of honor and address a large Legion meeting at the Municipal Auditorium, where his speech will be broadcast by radio station WDAG, between 8:30 and 9:00 p. m. with the possibility that the entire evening's program will go on the air, if it is possible to obtain the time.
