### SEED TO CHECK DUST STORMS DISTRIBUTED

WASHINGTON, June 19.—Seeds to help check dust storm erosion in Texas, Colorado and South Dakota has been distributed by the Farm Administration's seed conservation committee.

The committee announced 210,000 pounds of begari seed and 5,000 bushels of seed oats and barley had been turned over to the soil conservation service for planting in drouth territory on vacated lands that remain unplanted this year.

The seed goes to cooperating farmers within established erosion control projects who agree to plant it for cover purposes and for supplementary pasture. The object is to check blowing of top soil.

The begari seed will be distributed in Amarillo and Dalhart regions of Texas. The oats and barley go to Colorado and South Dakota.

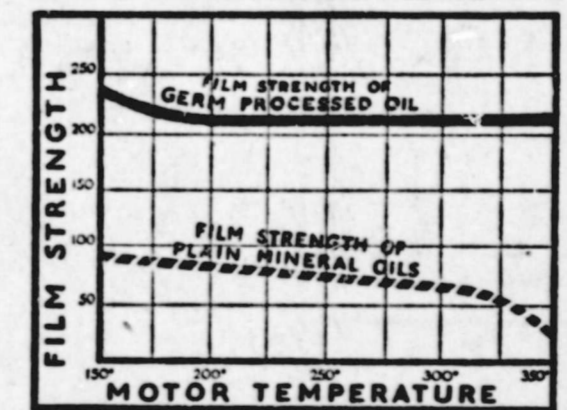

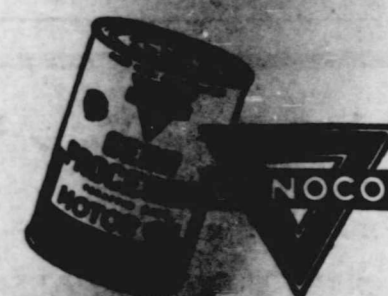

Joining forces, representative cattlemen from Wyoming, Colorado, Montana and South Dakota opened war on the rubber tired rustler

through a co-operative plan of brand exchanges.

The plan was outlined as representatives assembled for the opening session Tuesday of the Wyoming Stockgrowers' Association convention.

Stockmen called the new day stock thief as public enemy No. 1 of the modern ranges, charging that his depredation cost them thousands of dollars annually.

"With brand inspectors already working at big markets such as Denver, Chicago, Omaha, Kansas City and others, this new co-operative service should plug the loopholes through which modern rustlers have been escaping, said Russell Thorp, Wyoming cattleman.

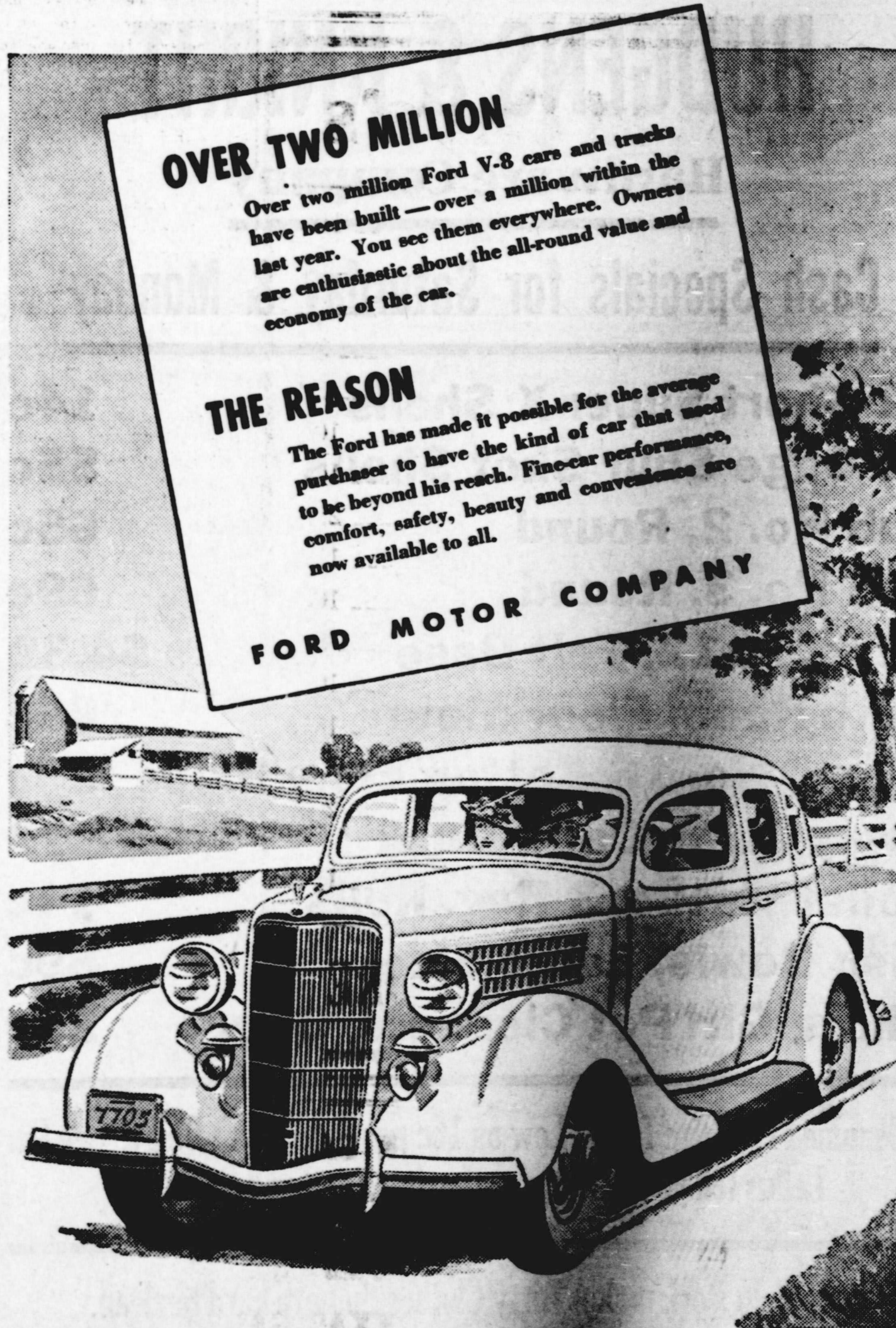
