Each garment entered must be accompanied by a typewritten letter of 200 words or less setting forth: the fabric from which the garment was made, the reason for its choice and its advantages for the use intended: the pattern used, or a statement that the garment was made according to the entrant's own design; and the total itemized cost of the garment, including fabrics, and all other components.

Entry blanks and rules for the ontest may be obtained in August and September through the state




