

SURPLUS POTATOES TO AID IN FEEDING OCCUPIED AREAS

Some 1,500,000 tons of surplus potatoes will be converted into 200,000 tons of potato flour for feeding peoples of the occupied areas in Germany and Japan under a program recently announced by the Office of the Food Administrator, Department of the Army.

The potatoes to be used represent part of the surplus foods acquired by the Commodity Credit Corporation in its operations in Beside making use of a surplus product which would ordinarily be Germany for urgently needed live-planting.




