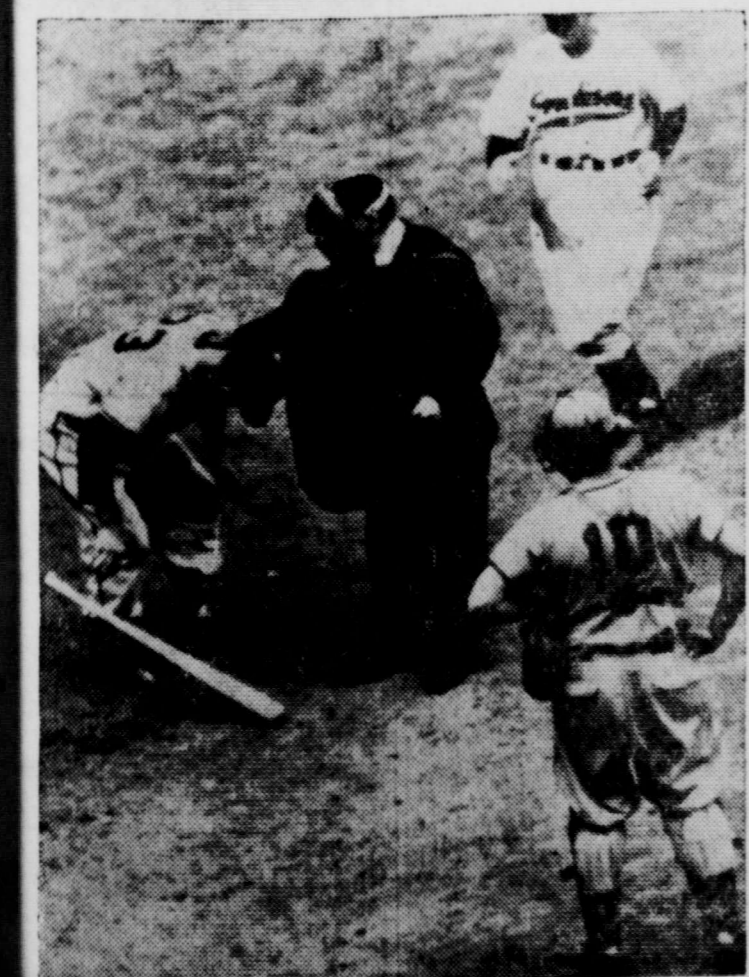

VFW To Hold Convention In Breckenridge

Texas Veterans of Foreign Wars will hold its semi-annual convention in Abilene, Sept. 18 and 19, according to Garland Coody, Breckenridge, district commander.

More than 500 officers and delegates of the 19 posts in the 15 Central-West Texas counties of the district are expected to attend the convention in Abilene.

With 4,345 paid-up members for 1948, District No. 8 is by far the largest in the state, and the convention will be the largest.

Commander Coody has announced the S. A. Childress, Waco, state VFW commander and Norman L. Summers, Austin, state adjutant will represent the Department of Texas at the District No. 8 convention, Commander Childress and his adjutant will arrive in Abilene the night of Sept. 17th and will remain throughout the two-day convention.

Commander Childress will be the convention's principal speaker and Adjutant Summers will conduct a school for adjutants and quartermasters.

Auxiliaries of the district also will hold their semi-annual convention at the same time with Mrs. Emma Kirby, Abilene district president in charge of the women's part of the convention.

Opening day of the convention will be devoted to registration of delegates during the afternoon, this to be followed by a dance at "Three Acres", home of the Clayton M. Leach Post 2012. Business sessions of both the VFW and auxiliary will feature the second days program.

National Guard Applies For Surplus Property

Pending application by the Texas National Guard for surplus property at five of the state's military installations have put the brake on disposal activities at these sites, according to disclosure today by Colonel Karl E. Wallace, director of the southwest region of War Assets Administration.

The WAA executive emphasized that approval by the armed forces in Washington, D.C., as well as by War Assets review boards will be necessary before land and buildings involved actually will be turned over to the National Guard. Meanwhile, he said, awards on at least two real property sales held recently by the agency are being held up awaiting a decision on withdrawal of buildings.

"The War Assets Administration will as usual do everything in its power to satisfy legitimate needs for national defense and, of course, this includes the needs of the National Guard," Colonel Wallace said. "Right now we are in the position of awaiting authority to determine how far we can go in complying with the requests."

The applications signed in behalf of the Guard by Governor Beauford Jester and Adjutant General L. K. Berry, have been referred by the Grand Prairie regional office to Washington for land, improvements and buildings at several locations.

Included is most of Fort Travis, Galveston, which had previously been requested by Galveston County for use as a public park and storm refuge.

Another site affected would be the San Antonio Arsenal, where the National Guard is requesting the portion of the installation lying east of the proposed state highway. Some of the arsenal property has already been transferred by WAA to the Navy and to the Public Building Administration.

The Guard has also initiated action to withdraw the commercial area as well as the lake and maneuver area of Camp Maxey, near Paris. Steps toward leasing much of the Camp Maxey area for grazing and agricultural usage by the WAA have already been taken.

In Bastrop County, near Austin, the Guard has requested the Camp Swift cantonment area, including portions formerly used by the army as hospital and warehouse area, as well as some of the maneuver area. This request was submitted on the day the WAA was to award sealed bids at a public sale of 354 Camp Swift buildings.

As a result, bids on approximately 180 of the buildings which lie by the Guard have been returned in tracts which would be claimed pending a decision on the withdrawal.

A similar situation occurred recently at Camp Shelby, Miss., where the Guard claimed a number of buildings about to be auctioned at a location sale. This claim, also awaits Washington approval. Guard is also requesting additional land besides its present holdings at Hattiesburg, Miss., site.

Sixty-fifth Annual Meeting of Baptist Association Held Here on September 14

Approximately three hundred Baptist from thirty-seven of the forty churches of the Cisco Baptist Association met in their annual meeting to hear reports of the past year's work and to lay plans for 1949.

Thirty-seven churches reported having raised nearly a quarter of a million dollars for the cause of Christ from August 31, 1947, to September 1, 1948. The churches reported having baptized 349 people this past year.

Rev. Henry Weldon, pastor of the First Baptist Church, Albany, Texas presided at the meeting. Dr. David M. editor of the Baptist Standard which has a circulation of two hundred and four thousand brought the main message of the afternoon session.

Dr. Gardner talked concerning the stewardship of money among Texas Baptists. He explained the ten million dollar budget of the Texas Baptist Convention for 1949. He also explained the use of the Sunday School literature especially for teaching stewardship among Baptists.

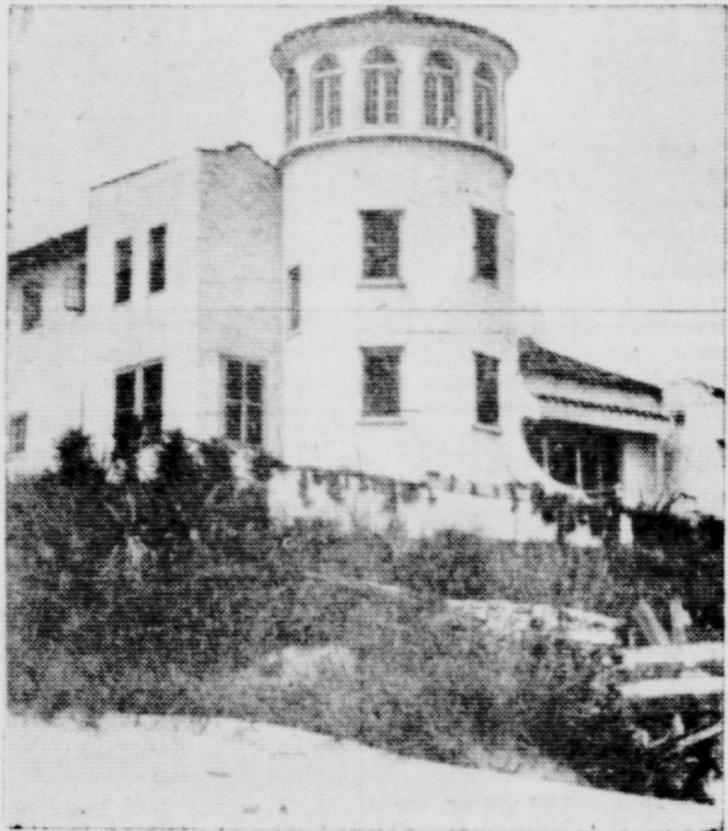

SURPLUS POTATOES TO AID IN FEEDING OCCUPIED AREAS

Some 11,800,000 tons of surplus potatoes will be converted into 200,000 tons of potato flour for feeding peoples of the occupied areas in Germany and Japan under a program recently announced by the Office of the Food Administrator, Department of the Army. The potatoes to be used represent part of the surplus foods acquired by the Commodity Credit Corporation in its operations in support of U. S. agricultural prices. Beside making use of a surplus product which would ordinarily be lost as a foodstuff, the program will permit diversion of grain in Germany for urgently needed livestock feed. Some of this year's potato surplus is also being shipped to Germany for seed for spring planting.

FLOOD CONTROL: Prevention of floods—a menace to American agriculture rivaled only by drought—is a major peacetime enterprise of the U. S. Army Engineers. For the fiscal year ending July 1, 1948, Congress appropriated \$298,322,825 for activities of the Corps of Engineers in construction, maintenance, and advance planning of levees, multiple-purpose dams and reservoirs, and other methods of flood prevention. The U. S. Engineer Corps currently has a backlog of nearly 200 projects which have been authorized, but for which all funds have not yet been appropriated. Total cost of these projects would exceed more than \$3,000,000,000.
