

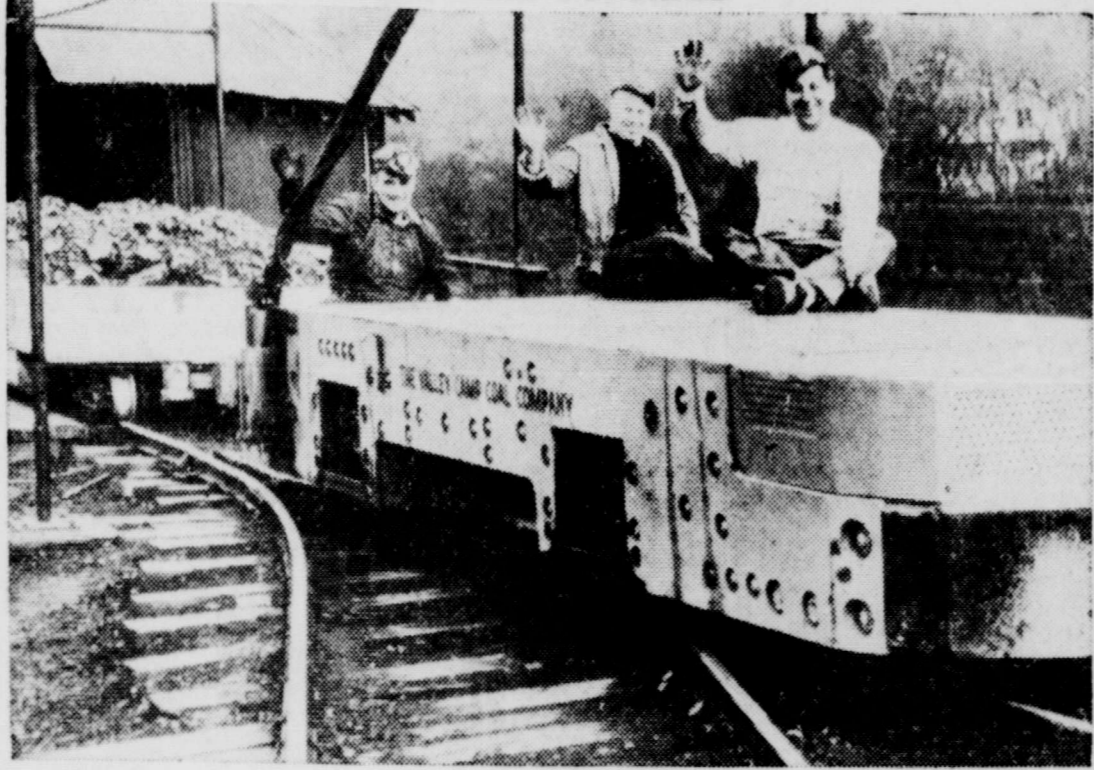

While entries in the cattle and other divisions of the Eastland County Livestock Show held in Cisco Friday and Saturday were curtailed by the heavy rain Friday morning, the horse show and the auction sale Saturday turned out to be the leading events of the annual exposition.

All entries in the club boys' divisions that were placed in the auction ring brought generally higher prices than at previous shows. A top price of 42 cents for the show champion. The prize money offered by the show association and special cash awards by local business firms brought approximately \$400.00 for the top steer, an entry in the light-weight division.

Charles Hipp of Graham won grand championship honors in the Quarter Horse mare division with Tiny, Sissie Britches, owned by Thena Mae Pharr of Seymour, won reserve honors.

Little Goldigger, owned by C. A. Ditmore of Cisco, was named grand champion stallion in the Palomino division. The Ditmore entry has won championships in many of the leading shows of the nation. The reserve champion Palomino stallion was J. Billy Thomas, owned by the Double Dot S Ranch of Moran.

Mrs. S. S. Messiter of Dallas took grand championship honors in the Palomino mare division with Ginger. Heel Fly, owned and shown by Bob Lucas of Fort Worth, walked away with the reserve championship award.

More than 150 of the leading horses of the Southwest were entered in the show and well known horsemen from as far away as Michigan were present for the judging. Plans were underway, at the completion of the show, to add to the facilities of the Livestock Association's plant in order to hold a bigger and better show next year.

Show officials expressed their thanks to all citizens for the manner in which they participated in the auction sale enabling the club boys to realize more for the faithfulness in which they worked with their entries.

In the men's division, M. E. Fry of Cisco showed the grand champion bull and the grand champion beef cow to walk away with the high points of the show.

President Myrick made the following statement in behalf of the entire organization: "It would be an endless task to personally thank everyone who contributed of their time and money to make our livestock show a success. However, we would be very ungrateful not to express our appreciation. "Although we have received many compliments, we are not content with the accomplishments of the past. With the continued cooperation of everyone, an exposition second to none can become a reality.
