make the youth of America aware of the fact that the country's destination lies in their hands. The Mutual Benefit Head Accident Association of Nebraska, is offering a \$4,000 scholarship to the student who writes the best oration based on the theme, "Live Safely - Live Happily." Any junior or senior student in school is eligible.

The contest will be held in the United States the contest will be local, state, regional, national, and international. In some communities there may be district contests held between the time of local contests and the state contest.

Exact dates have been set for the contests except the regional and international contests. However, the contests must be held by certain dates. Each contest must select its winner by January 3. The local contest

must be over by February 17th, and the state contest by March 10th and the regional contest on April 4th. If the district contests are held they must be over by February 28.

The contest rules are:

1. Contestants must be either juniors or seniors in a public, private, or parochial high school at the time they compete in all divisions of the contest.
2. The oration must be the original effort of each contestant. The same prepared oration must be used throughout the contest. The penalty for plagiarism will be disqualification.
3. The oration must require not less than 10 minutes nor more than 12 minutes.
4. Informal dress will be required. Uniforms of all types are barred.
5. In the oration quotations must be indicated as such, and the author's name given.
6. The winner of each local contest must immediately send the state chairman a copy of his speech.
7. If a contestant is disqualified or withdraws from the contest after progressing through one or more of its stages, his or

her place is to be taken by the contestant adjudged next best to him in the last competition in which he participated prior to disqualification or withdrawal.

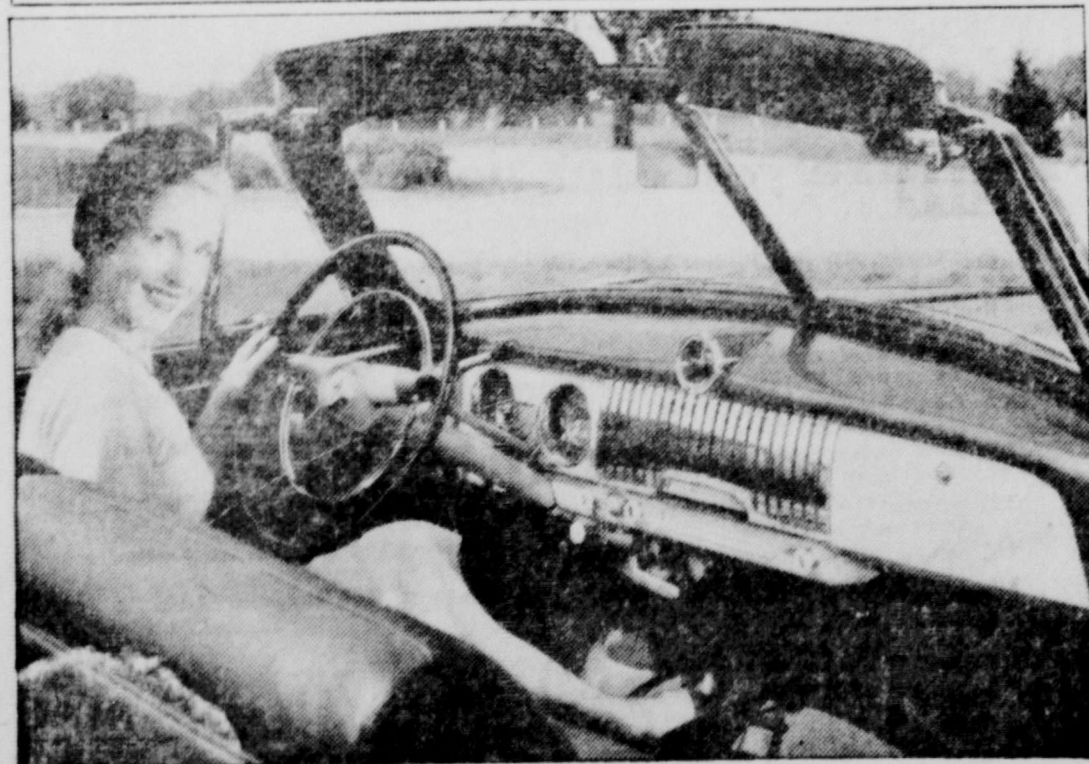
