Gurley Elected County Attorney

If we start naming names we will leave someone out. So let's just give a huge thanks to all the election judges, poll volunteers, law enforcement for delivering the ballot boxes, and to County Clerk Colleen Stover and her staff for the hours and hours they put in during this election season.

And a special thanks should go to the candidates themselves who threw their name in the hat and entered

the competition for public office. Running for office is the American way so let's appreciate the people who, win or lose, make the time and effort to enter the races.

Mrs. Stover said that the snow and ice on election day did not deter voters in Parmer County. Counting early votes and Tuesday's turnout, 3,892 Parmer County votes were cast in the Presidential race; 3,792 in the District 19 congressional

race; and 3,620 votes in the county attorney race.

Friona attorney Kathryn

Gurley, running as a write-in candidate, won the county attorney office from incumbent Jeff Actkinson. Gurley won 2,014 to 1,606, carrying all precincts except 203 (Rhea), 301 (Farwell), and 302 (Okla Lane). She was also strong in early voting by a 591-436 margin. Gurley will assume the office on January 1, 2005, and the term is for four years.

In the Precinct 3 county commissioner race, incumbent Ronald Byrd lost to Michael Haseloff by only 5 votes, 647-642. Precinct 3 covers the Farwell area. At press time Byrd told supporters he had no plans for a recount.

In state and national races, President George Bush easily outpaced John Kerry in the county by a vote of 3,340 to 542. Randy Neugebauer was also Parmer

County's choice for District 19 congressman, winning here by 2,442 to 1,300 over Charlie Stenholm.

State senator Kel Seliger received 3,059 votes to soundly defeat Elaine King Miller's 611 votes. In the races for Supreme Court Justices and Court of Criminal Appeals judges, the county followed the Republican Party line casting the overwhelming majority of votes to the Republican candidates. Victor Carrillo received the majority (2,487) of county votes for Railroad Commissioner.

Unopposed county candidates extending their offices for another term are Johnny Actkinson, District Attorney; Randy Geries, Sheriff; Bobbie Pierson, County Tax Assessor-Collector; and Kirk Frye, County Commissioner Precinct 1.

Early Snowfall Keeps Friona On Record Pace

A heavier than usual, and earlier than usual snowfall in the wee hours of Tuesday, kept Friona's chances of topping the all-time moisture record alive and well.

An estimated 7.5 inches of snow were received at the city and county's official gauge on Tuesday. Having been preceded

by a light rain most of the day on Monday, the official moisture measurement was 1.30 inches.

That brought the yearly moisture total to 33.38 inches, with still two months to go in the year. The total moisture is now 7.19 inches behind the record of 40.57 inches, set in 1941.

To reach or surpass the record, we'd have to average .80 inches of moisture per week in the final nine weeks of the year.

Before you say, "it ain't possible", we'd note that this is virtually the exact average, per week, of the present yearly to-

tal. This writer's friend, Doyce Barnett, told him prior to the latest moisture, he remembers a time several years ago when the Friona area received four inches of rain in December, and emphasized the point that it was all in the form of rain.

(Good thing, too, since that could have amounted to as much as four feet of snow!)

FEDC Officers Elected, Loans Discussed

The Friona Economic Development Corporation (FEDC) met in regular session Monday, November 1. Officers re-elected were Bill Stovell president, Kathryn Goddard vice-president, and Lois Norwood secretary. Board members are Robert Neelley, John Baca, Clarence Monroe, and Ron Davenport. City manager Terri Johnson keeps minutes of FEDC meetings and Chamber exec Chris Alexander is FEDC executive director.

The FEDC is funded by a 1/2 of one percent sales tax. Johnson said for the 2003-04 fiscal year the FEDC collected \$69,792.60. Money to support local businesses is given in the form of loans or grants. Loans have to be paid back. Grants do not.

There are loans currently to Campbell Electric, MC Designs, T & S Concrete, and Veterinary Industries. Black Ridge Dairy and Lone Star Dairy are each being paid grants of \$10,000 per year for five years. The FEDC also pays \$500 monthly rent for the Boll Weevil Foundation office space.

The board discussed the delinquency of MC Designs, a

City Council To Hear PD Complaint Petition

Friona resident Francisco Ortiz has asked for time on the agenda of Monday's Friona city council meeting, which begins at 6:30 p.m. Ortiz plans to present a petition with more than 250 signatures calling for "the removal of Joe Lopez, Jr." from the Friona police department.

The text of the petition states: "We, the undersigned residents of the City of Friona, Texas, request the removal of Joe Lopez, Jr. from his position as a police officer for the Friona Police Department. Mr. Lopez, in the course of his duties as a police officer, is persistently disrespectful, uncooperative, and unprofessional. His overall demeanor conveys a negative attitude toward the community. It is our belief that Mr. Lopez' conduct as a representative of city government reflects poorly on the Department and brings discredit to the City of Friona." Mr. Ortiz hired attorney Byron Boyd to advise him on the drafting of the petition wording.

According to city manager Terri Johnson, Sgt. Lopez is presently on a six-month probation at the police department that was in effect prior to Ortiz's petition. The probation stemmed from a series of citizen complaints. Lopez has been a member of the Friona police department since January 2001. He was formerly a police officer in Bovina and a deputy with the Parmer County Sheriff's office.

Because it involves personnel, the mayor and city council are required to discuss the matter in closed session. Mayor John Taylor said the city council does not have the authority to hire and fire police officers. That duty is up to the police chief. The city council and the city manager can only make recommendations in personnel matters.

Also on the tentative meeting agenda is an item to consider approval of a proposed increase in rates for ambulance services and awarding of a bid to sell one of the city's sewer machines.

The city hall meeting area is wheelchair accessible. Requests for accommodations or interpretive services should be made 48 hours prior to the meeting. For further information contact city manager Terri Johnson at 250-2761.

The next meeting of the FEDC will be November 16 at 7:30 a.m. in the Chamber of Commerce boardroom. A representative of High Ground, a Panhandle economic development group, will be on the program. Also officials expect to hear an application proposal for opening a local steakhouse restaurant.

Veterans Day Is A Day To Remember Sacrifices

From the brave last stand at the Alamo in 1836, to rugged Monte Casino during World War II, to the desert sands of Iraq, Texans have earned a reputation for not backing down in the fight for freedom even when it may cost them their lives. It is to honor these brave soldiers that we celebrate Veteran's Day, and take time to remember so much given on our behalf.

Texas has our nation's third-largest veteran community, according to the 2000 census. Over 1.7 million of our 26.5 million veterans live in the Lone Star state. Texas is also home to a large number of defense facilities, with over 114,000 military personnel stationed in our bases. Texans serve around the globe, on land, sea and air, defending this nation and all who value freedom. As we pay our respects this Veteran's Day, I hope we will also pause to show them our gratitude as well.

I try to express my thanks to our veterans by doing my part in Congress, where I serve on the Veterans Affairs Committee. There I have worked with my colleagues to ensure we provide our veterans the best possible resources and care. In recent years, we've passed a range of legislation that addressed the needs of our veteran community: the Veterans' Opportunities Act, which created new life insurance and health care benefits for up to two million eligible spouses and children of veterans; the Homeless Veterans Comprehensive Assistance Act that authorized \$1 billion to aid homeless veterans and prevent others from becoming homeless; and the Veterans Education and Benefits Expansion Act, which authorized more than \$3.1 billion over five years to expand and increase educational, housing, burial and disability benefits.

Earlier we introduced legislation to assist Medicare-eligible veterans struggling with the costs of prescription medications. And, we have continued to pass strong Defense and Military Construction appropriations bills to ensure our troops are fully equipped to face the enemy.

Fighting in distant lands can be lonely and trying for troops who miss home. Yet every day we see more evidence of a "can do" spirit and Texas ingenuity to help bridge the gap between our troops and their loved ones. Eighteen-year-old Victor Roger's dad proudly saw him graduate from high school in Belton even though his father is serving in Baghdad. Several enterprising high schools in the Fort Hood vicinity hooked up a video system to allow proud parents and their children see each other on graduation day. If anyone wants to talk about family values, they should look at our men and women in uniform.

And speaking of values, it is good to know that the courage that burned in the soldiers of the Alamo still shines brightly. Sgt. Pamela Osbourne used to call her husband Rohan almost every day from her supply depot in Baghdad. Her last conversation with her husband is poignant. "Hold your head up, baby," she said. "I'm coming home. Even if I come home in a box, you should know that I did it for you. Take care of the kids. Stay strong. And remember that I love you."

Unfortunately, she and a fellow soldier were killed the next day in a mortar attack. Sgt. Osbourne joined the ranks of those veterans who have died so we may remain free. An immigrant who came to our country at age 14, she had two goals; to become a citizen and to serve in the Army. In fulfilling her dream, she made that ultimate sacrifice.

Her devotion to her adopted country reflects the fierce loyalty which makes America the greatest nation on earth. This Veterans Day, Americans pay tribute to those extraordinary men and women who in every war have unflinchingly answered the call to duty. Their memories will remain part of the fabric of our nation forever. To our veterans and their families. Thank you and God bless you.

Stenholm Heads To The Farm

After 26 years in Congress, Democrat Charlie Stenholm is headed home to West Texas.

Forced to run in a new district after Republican legislators redrew congressional voting lines, Stenholm couldn't win over voters in the Republican-leaning District 19. He lost Tuesday to freshman Rep. Randy Neugebauer, a Lubbock Republican who took 58 percent of the vote.

"We had a good run," Stenholm said. "We'd like to believe we've made a contribution but that's for others to judge."

Stenholm is the ranking Democrat on the House Agriculture Committee, so his departure concerns some farmers, especially following the retirement last year of Rep. Larry Combest, who was committee chair. Neugebauer was elected to serve out the rest of Combest's term.

"Charlie's 26 years of experience and his high ranking in Congress will be sorely missed by

cotton producers when we move toward crafting the next farm bill," Plains Cotton Growers Inc. spokesman Roger Haldenby said.

Stenholm, 66, said his immediate plan was to work for a time with his son, who is a farmer. "We've got a cotton crop to get out, and some wheat to plant," Stenholm said. But Stenholm did not rule out a return to public service. "Obviously, I'm still young enough to know that we want to do something," Stenholm said. "But I don't know what that's going to be right now."

The Ericksdahl native was among four Texas Democratic congressman targeted in last year's GOP-led redistricting who lost Tuesday.

His career was marked by gains for agriculture, since his district is key to the nation's cotton and beef production. Stenholm also helped found the Blue Dog Coalition, a group of moderate to conservative Demo-

crats whose main focus is fiscal responsibility.

Stenholm worked closely with Combest to shape the \$180 billion farm bill in 2002. It raised subsidy rates for grain and cotton growers and revived a system to provide supplemental income when commodity prices fall below certain levels. Texas got the biggest increase in subsidies under the bill.

Stenholm also served on small

business, veterans affairs and budget committees, and this fall was named to the House Armed Services Committee.

He said he did regret leaving Congress with a bit of unfinished business. "We spent a good part of the last nine years trying to be part of a constructive fix on Social Security, and we didn't get it done," he said. "And that's a regret."

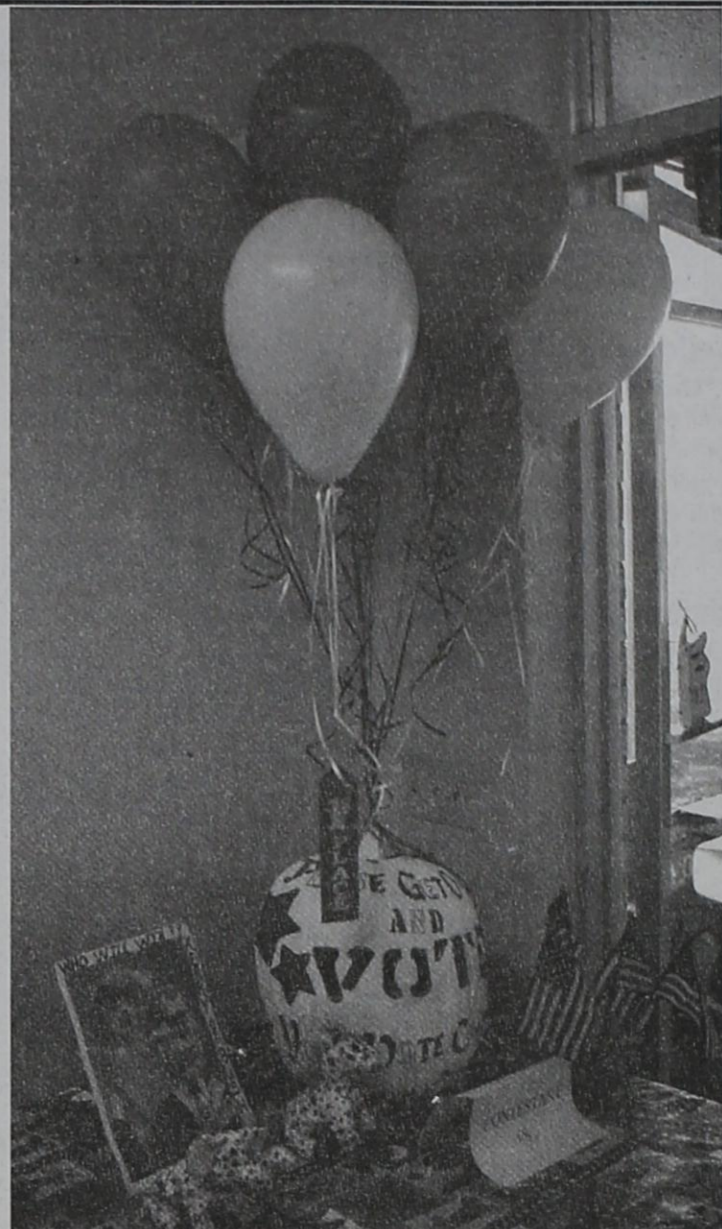

Chieftains Trampled by Mustangs 42-28

With 9:30 left in the 2nd quarter, the Friona Chieftains led the Olton Mustangs 14-7. In less than three more minutes, with 6:46 left in the quarter, the score was tied 21-21. At the half Olton led 28-21. It was that kind of night as the Mustangs put away the Chieftains 42-28 and all but eliminated Friona from the playoffs.

Olton's speedy running back David Phares burned the Chieftains for five touchdowns, four in the first half.

Phares capped off Olton's opening 70-yard drive with a 34-yard TD run. The Chiefs took the kickoff starting from their 25-yard line but went three and out. Antonio Monreal's punt gave Olton the ball at their own 20.

After two first downs, Willy Castillo intercepted an Olton pass and returned it to the 29-yard line. From there it was Sergio Saenz that did most of the work as he had a 20-yard gain, caught a pass, and ran for another first down.

A pass to Freddy Reyes and a keeper by quarterback Derek

Fairweather moved Friona to the 5-yard line as time expired in the 1st quarter. On the first play of Q2, Reyes took an option pitchout and scored from 6 yards.

Things looked up for Friona on the next series as Olton fumbled on their first play after the kickoff and Eduardo Godoy recovered at the 20. Jacob Hoon covered about 18 yards on two plays and Saenz bulled in from the 2-yard line giving Friona their only lead of the night 14-7 with 9:30 left in the 2Q.

It took a little less than 15 seconds for Phares to cover 98-yards straight ahead with the kickoff to tie 14-14.

Friona received the next kickoff, ran two plays then fumbled on the third try and Olton recovered at their own 43. On the first play it was Phares again covering 57 yards to give Olton a 21-14 lead with 7:00 left in the 2Q.

On the Olton kickoff, Friona's own speedster Freddy Reyes raced 81 yards to TD paydirt, tying the score once again 21-21.

The teams had combined for three touchdowns in little more than two minutes. Friona kicked off and this time contained the Mustangs as Hayden Patton led a charge and stopped Phares for a loss. Then the Chiefs defense sacked the Olton QB when they went for it on 4th and 13.

The excitement was short lived. On the ensuing series, Olton intercepted a Fairweather pass, then passed their way down to a 4th and one from the six and Phares scored again with 34 seconds left in the half.

There were some weird plays in the second half which did not go Friona's way. Olton kicked off to open the half. The squib-kick attempt turned into an on-side kick

as the ball hit a Chief and Olton recovered.

Olton could not take advantage though as the teams traded punts. Olton opened their next series in the shotgun formation, were held on downs by the Chief defense, but a running into the kicker 15-yard penalty* against Friona gave Olton new life at the 25-yard line. With 1st and goal from the 9-yard line, Phares again scored to put the Mustangs ahead 34-21.

Another fluke play gave Olton some life. After Friona held the Mustangs for three downs, an Olton punt hit David Davila in the back down field and the Mustangs recovered again, this time at Friona's 21-yard line.

Olton had a TD called back and were penalized out to the 33-yard line. An incomplete pass on 4th and 15 gave Friona the ball with 7:00 left in the 4Q.

But another Olton interception, followed by a clipping penalty on the return, and the Mustangs had the ball again at the 47. By now the Chieftain defense had been on the field most of the second half. An Olton TD run of 26 yards by Deberry and a successful 2-point conversion put Olton up by 42-21 with about 4:00 left.

Friona's final drive ended in a Sergio Saenz TD from the 1-yard line with :35 seconds remaining.

The loss tied Friona and Olton for third place with identical records with one game left. In order to qualify for the playoffs Friona has to beat Lockney and Tulia must beat Olton Friday night.

Lockney is 4-0 in district play and sport their own top running back in Mark Ford. It will be Friona's final home game of the season and senior parents' night. Senior parents will be presented prior to the game.

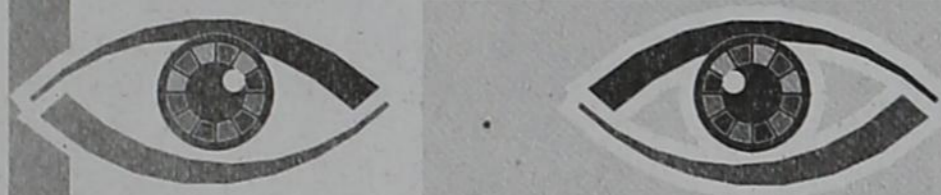

What Is Astigmatism?

Did you know that approximately two-thirds of Americans have a condition called astigmatism? In this optical condition, the front skin of the eye, called the cornea, is irregular in its shape. If a person were to measure the roundness of the cornea, the astigmatic eye would have two different curvatures. In other words, this "front skin" of the eye has a steep curve and a flat curve, much like a football. It's not perfectly round.

The effect of astigmatism is to cause images to form near the retina, but not on the retina. This results in blurred vision. People with uncorrected astigmatism who do a lot of reading or computer work will often complain of headaches and eyestrain. Depending on your optical prescription, your symptoms, and the type of prescription you need, your doctor may decide to fit you with corrective eyeglasses or contact lenses. If you suspect you may have a vision problem, the best way to find out for certain is to visit your optometrist today.

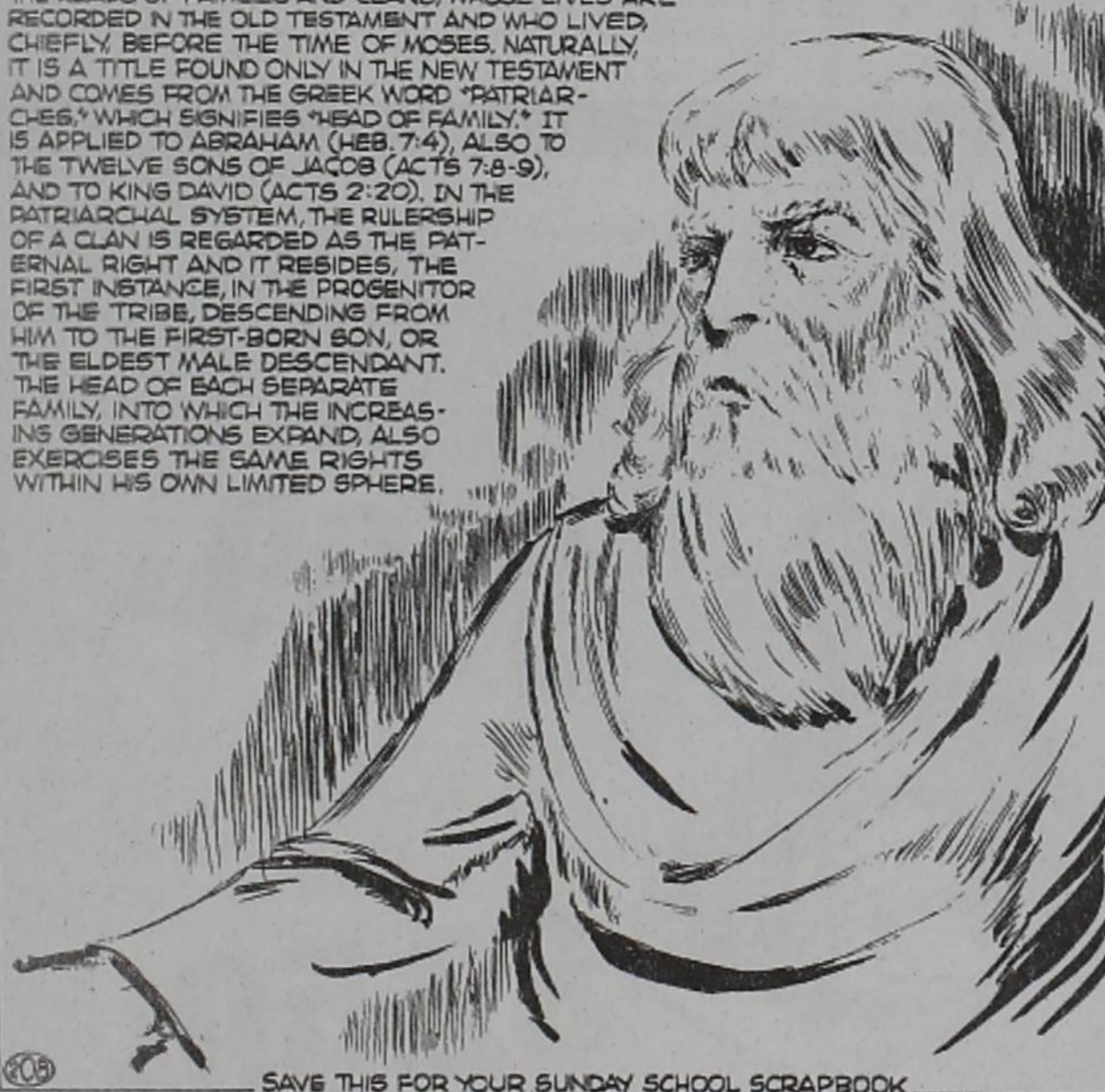

Farm Heads In Congress May Change

After Tuesday's election, there will be at least one, and possible two, new leaders on the U.S. House and Senate Agriculture committees whose top task will be confronting demands to cut farm spending in 2005 as the federal budget deficit grows.

Agriculture Committee leaders in both chambers will also face renewed proposals to lower the \$360,000 a year limit on subsidies per farmer, say analysts and farm lobbyists.

At the same time, crop subsidy costs are expected to zoom by about \$7 billion in the coming year because of slumping grain and soybean prices. Dairy-state lawmakers want to extend a milk subsidy and the first "green payment" program for farmers has been raided to pay for disaster aid and needs replenishment.

"The big 800-pound gorilla is going to be the budget deficit," said farm analyst Otto Doering of Purdue University. "There are no

goodies to hand out for agriculture."

If Republicans retain control of the Senate, Thad Cochran of Mississippi will leave the chairmanship of the Agriculture Committee and switch to heading the Appropriations Committee, say congressional staff workers. Polls generally show Republicans are slightly ahead of Democrats to claim a majority in the Senate.

Chairmanship of the U.S. Senate agriculture panel would pass to either Pat Roberts of Kansas, an old farm-policy hand, or to first-termer Saxby Chambliss of Georgia. Roberts' first choice was for another term as Intelligence Committee chairman but he needs approval from party leaders.

Roberts was a leader in deregulating U.S. agriculture in 1996 but also made sure aid was provided when markets nosedived later in the decade.

Chambliss is a friend of Southern crops like cotton, which cur-

rently enjoy generous subsidy payments. Analysts say he would oppose any cuts in farm-payment limits and would be wary of trade agreements that allow more imports of dairy, cotton, sugar and rice.

Another Republican member of the agriculture panel, Iowa Republican Charles Grassley, is a bulldog proponent of cutting the maximum subsidy per-farmer and has promised to raise the issue again.

If Democrats win the Senate,

Tom Harkin of Iowa would return as Agriculture Committee chairman, an aide said. Harkin used a stint as chairman earlier this decade to create the Conservation Security Program, which pays farmers to make land, water and wildlife stewardship a part of their daily work.

The fledgling conservation program has only awarded a few thousand contracts and its funding has been under attack.

Disaster Calculator Available On PCG Website

Passage of the 2003/2004 Agricultural Disaster Program has many producers, landlords and Ag lenders looking for a tool to help them calculate their Crop Disaster Program payments.

Last week, Plains Cotton Growers dusted off its Single Farm Disaster Payment Calculator, and with the assistance of Jay Yates, Extension Specialist—Risk Management, updated it to estimate 2003 or 2004 disaster benefits.

Yates has also updated his comprehensive Multiple Farm Disaster Payment Calculator that allows producers to input information on multiple farms and estimate how much assistance may be available for their entire operation.

The calculators have been developed specifically for use by cotton producers on the Texas High Plains.

Producers who downloaded the Single Farm Calculator last week should go back and get the latest version posted October 27 which corrects an error in the formula that selects the higher of the producer's APH yield or the County Average.

At this time there is essentially no concrete information about how the 2003/2004 Agriculture Disaster Program will function. The legislation authorizing it refers to components used in both the 2000 and the 2001/2002 Crop Disaster Programs.

Boiled down to simple language the new law instructs the Farm Service Agency to conduct the program in basically the same manner as the 2001/2002 CDP except using a higher payment rate structure from the 2000 CDP.

Producers are advised to use the calculators as ESTIMATION TOOLS ONLY and check the PCG website regularly for updated versions. Updates will be posted once a better knowledge of the rules is available.

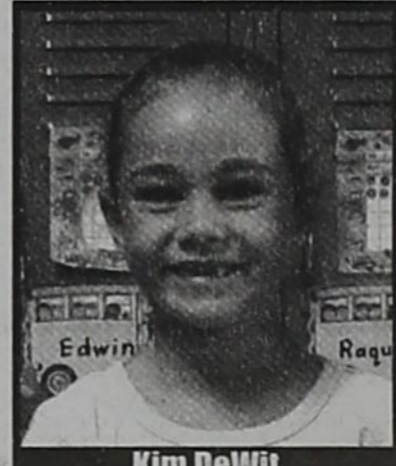
