WHO PAYS THE DOCTOR?

Once again, Americans have shown they prefer to work out their own problems in their own way.

This time it's the cost of medical care. The July-September issue of American Economic Security, published by the Chamber of Commerce of the United States, notes that more than 85,000,000 Americans had insured themselves against hospital bills in 1951. That's well over half the population.

Many more also have insured themselves against medical and surgical bills, while 39,702,000 or nearly two thirds of all employed civilians, are protected against loss of pay due to accident or sickness.

These figures do not include military service people and their dependents, veterans or persons covered by workmen's compensation, all of whom are protected to varying extent against medical costs by law.

Even more remarkable than the great number of persons voluntarily protected, the Chamber believes, is the swift growth of voluntary health insurance in just a little more than ten years.

Before World War II, there was a "great debate" about the cost of medical care. Many believed that only a compulsory, government-regulated insurance system could solve the problem. Others, including most doctors, were afraid of "state medicine," as the compulsory insurance plan was called. They thought voluntary health insurance deserved a fair trial, first.

That's why the new figures are significant. They became even more so when compared with the health insurance statistics of 1940.

For example, the 85,000,000 Americans insured against hospital expense in 1951, compares with 12,312,000 in 1940. That's a growth of nearly 700 per cent in 11 years.

Surgical insurance covered 65,535,000 in 1951, an increase of 1300 per cent over the total of 5,350,000 in 1940.

Insurance against medical bills has risen from 3,900,000 in 1940 to 27,723,000 in 1951, or almost 900 per cent. This last is the newest but fastest growing type of health insurance. It provides benefits toward payment of doctors' bills not included in surgical insurance.

All of this means not only better medical care for more people, but a lot less worry about who is going to pay for it.

It also means, the Chamber points out, that no one can predict the limits of voluntary insurance in protecting our citizens against the cost of medical and hospital care.

Lamps Aid Winter Sun in Growing Window Garden



Winter gardening methods have been greatly improved by research in the effectiveness of artificial light on plant growth. It is possible for any one to have flowering plants in the house, even through a sunny window is not available.

By using a photographic light meter, which nearly all amateur photographers now possess, you can check the light from your best window to see whether the daylight is adequate for the plants you wish to grow.

An intensity of 50 foot candles for twelve hours a day is sufficient to develop the flowers of bulbs, such as tulips, daffodils, Paper White narcissi, lily of the valley, and amaryllis. To measure the light that falls on the place where your plants can be kept, lay two sheets of white paper flat, one above the other. Hold a Weston light meter six inches above the paper, being careful not to cast a shadow. Multiply the meter reading by four and you will have approximately the foot-candles of light available to your plants.

The bulbs take less light than other flowering pot plants, which need about 500 foot candles each 12 hours, and should not be attempted except in a south window, which enjoys direct sunlight or a large east, west or north window which receives the full reflected light of the sky.

Temperature is important in growing indoor flowers, next to light. There is more trouble from high temperatures than from low. Here windows which do not face south enjoy an advantage. Plants can be kept close to the glass, where the temperature is more stable, and usually much cooler than in the center of the room.

Watering is the third important factor affecting plants. The old fashioned method of soaking the soil with water, then allowing it to dry out, is still the best one. As the soil dries, air enters, insuring the roots necessary oxygen. When methods of automatic watering are used, there may be danger of keeping the soil saturated, so that air is excluded.

If a large pan can be provided holding two or three inches of sand, pots can stand on this sand; and if water is kept standing just below the bottom of the pot, moisture will be taken up by the pot as needed. Another way is to insert in the pot, through the drainage hole at the bottom, a wick of fibre glass, or a piece of clothes line. If the top of the wick is imbedded in the soil, and the bottom drops into a pan of water, the soil will be kept moist without saturation. To arrange either of these devices requires some ingenuity, but it can be done at small expense.

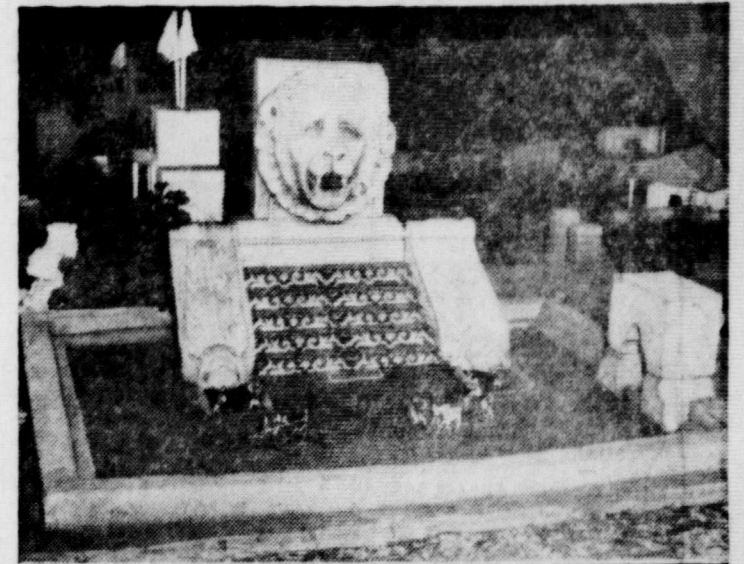

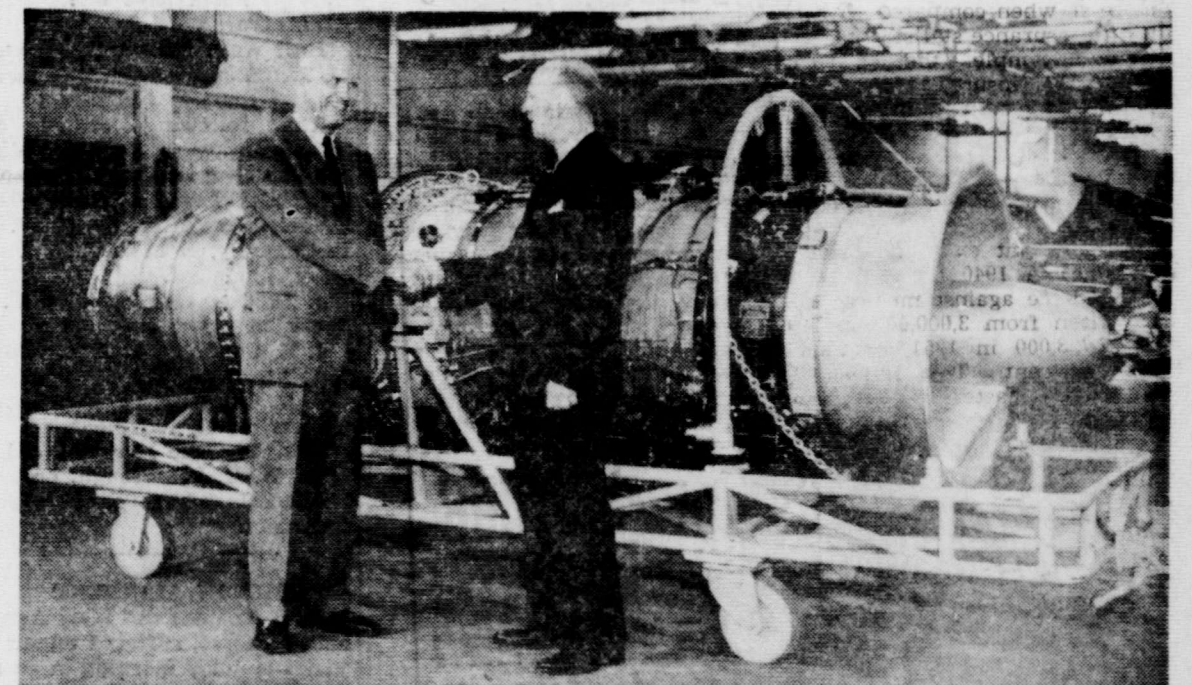

## Deferments Seen For Apprentices In Labor Ranks

AUSTIN, Oct. 2.—Union labor jointly with management, is making a large participation in the draft deferment program in Texas to maintain and increase the ranks of skilled workers, Brig. Gen. Paul L. Wakefield, state Selective Service director, said here today.

Out of 67 apprentice training programs approved by state Selective Service headquarters since the program began in July, union labor is participating in 52 of them, the state draft director revealed.

Programs approved involve carpenters, plumbers and pipefitters, printers, bricklayers, tile setters, stonemasons, painters, plasterers, decorators, paperhangers, railway, electrical, and sheet metal workers, among others.

After apprentice training programs are approved, apprentice deferment requests must be made on each apprentice for which a deferment is sought, the state draft director pointed out.

"It is not mandatory on local boards to defer apprentices," General Wakefield said. "However, boards have been urged to defer any registrants who fully meet the requirements of the program."

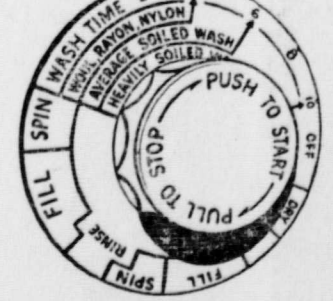
