## Council declines golf course takeover

The Friona city council met in regular session Monday September 8 at the council chambers on Main St. to consider a 21-item agenda.

### Country Club will continue operations

After the council meeting, Friona Country Club board member Jay Beene said the country club will continue to operate.

"We're going to keep the golf course open and hope to increase the membership," Beene said. "The course is also open to the public. You don't have to be a member to play golf here. We need to increase the golf traffic at the course and urge anyone interested to contact us about membership."

The Friona Country Club board had petitioned the council to take over operations of the country club and golf course. The council tabled the item at the August meeting and rescheduled it for September.

Monday night the council informed country club representatives that the city will not be taking over operation of the club and course. "We don't want to see it (the golf course) go away," Mayor Taylor said, "we just can't do it at this time. The city has too many other issues to address." The council said that they may reconsider in 6 months to a year and entered the item in the minutes as "no action taken".

Country Club board president Gary Renner thanked the mayor and the council for their consideration during the past few months of discussion.

Budgets were approved for the city, the Friona Economic Development Corporation (FEDC), and Prairie Acres Nursing Home.

The FEDC budget was approved at \$83,100 and the council appointed Robert Neelley,

J.B. Douglas, and Bill Stovell to the FEDC board. City manager Terri Johnson said the budget is less than last year because the sales tax revenue is down slightly.

Allied Waste, the company that collects Friona trash, was approved for a rate increase to commercial dumpster customers. No trash collection increase was requested for residential customers at this point but the council expects Allied Waste to assess an increase in the future. Mayor Taylor said the waste collection is a "pass through" meaning the city charges only what they are charged.

A slight increase in water usage rates was approved. The base rate of 0-2000 gallons remains the same. Usage over 2,000 gallons was increased by \$.50 cents per 1,000.

The Prairie Acres 2008-09 budget was approved at \$3,008,837 in projected revenue and \$2,825,470 in operating expense, based on 57 residents. There are currently 50 residents at Prairie Acres and 7 at Heritage Estates. Several employees and concerned

citizens attended the council in a show of support for Prairie Acres. The council reiterated their goal of trying to keep Prairie Acres locally owned and operated.

Mayor Taylor said the city is actively seeking a permanent administrator for Prairie Acres and stated the certification requirements for an administrator are very strict.

City manager Johnson advised that EMS Director Kelly Daniel has received grant money for a new ambulance and a new chassis for the "box" of the second ambulance. Mrs. Daniel said the EMS has received a \$104,500 federal Assistance to Firefighters grant for the new ambulance and a \$30,000 matching Texas Local Project Grant to replace the chassis on the second ambulance.

The council voted to reset the October 13 council meeting because of the Columbus Day holiday. The next city council meeting will be Monday October 20 at 6:30 p.m. in the council chambers.

### Noon Lions burgers at River Road game

The Friona Noon Lions Club will hold its annual hamburgers and fries tailgate party prior to the River Road vs. Chieftains football game Friday night. Cookers will be adjacent to the concession stand.

Serving should begin between 6-6:30 p.m. and will continue during the game. Cost is \$6 for a hamburger and fries. The Booster Club will be selling drinks.

### August weather

Local weather guy John Gurley reports a total of 7.29 inches of rain during August, with the heaviest amount (2.40 inches) falling on August 30. Another 3.91 inches fell during the 3-day span of August 16-18.

We reached a high of 97 degrees August 1 with temperatures moderating throughout August. The high temperature on August 18 was 68 with a monthly low of 57 during August 18-0. The average high during the month was 86.7 and the average low was 61.5.

### Train vs. truck wreck at Cargill

About 4 a.m. Wednesday morning a west-bound BNSF train smashed into the right rear of a semi-trailer loaded with beef at the Cargill plant on Highway 60. The driver of the semi- and the train conductors were not injured but the trailer was destroyed and packaged beef was scattered along the tracks.

The driver of the England Trucking Company truck had pulled out of the plant, crossed the tracks and stopped at Highway 60. The rear of his trailer was still on the north set of tracks. DPS Trooper Joel Rejino said the driver told him he stopped to call his dispatcher to get directions to California, the destination of the load of beef.

Conductors said they saw the truck and locked down the train brakes but were too late to avoid the trailer. It took the train another ¼ mile to finally stop. The train struck the right rear portion of the trailer, sliding it sideways into a guardrail and

knocking down a BNSF crossing arm signal pole.

Cargill employees brought another trailer to the location and offloaded the beef and picked up the scattered boxes. Workers cut away the side of the damaged trailer to transfer the beef boxes. Trans Matic Wrecker Service out of Clovis brought two heavy duty wreckers to haul off the trailer.

England Trucking Company is headquartered in Indiana and the truck driver, making only his second trip from the Cargill plant, is a resident of Washington State.

BNSF officials were on scene to repair the crossing arm and signal pole as soon as the trailer wreckage was removed. Sheriff Randy Geries said they would have to use flaggers to direct traffic in and out of the plant, especially during the mid-afternoon shift change, until the crossing signals were repaired.

Friona volunteer firemen and Friona EMS also responded to the scene of the 4 a.m. accident.

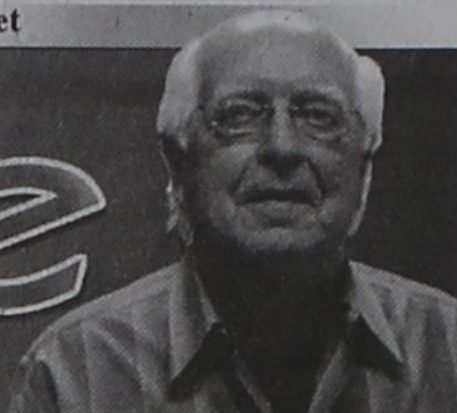

## Angry shrimp with Tuscan white beans

How do you make a shrimp angry? Talk ugly about his little shrimp kids I guess. Maybe you sprinkle some chili powder on them.

I like shrimp prepared any way from raw to breaded and fried to garlic baked. This recipe seems a little complicated at first but maybe not to an experienced cook like you. You will soon see the need to buy some Progresso products. Aren't they in the soup aisle? You'll need plenty of small bowls too. What is a panko bread crumb? Oh well.

The recipe is in three stages so here goes. Bon appetit'.

## Angry Shrimp with Tuscan White Beans

- 4 servings
- Bean mixture**
- 1 can (19 oz) Progresso cannellini beans, drained & rinsed
  - 2 tbsp extra virgin olive oil
  - 3/4 cup Progresso chicken broth
  - 1 tsp lemon juice
  - 1 tbsp chopped fresh Italian flat leaf parsley
- Coating mixture**
- 1 cup all purpose flour
  - 4 1/2 tsp California chili powder
  - 1 tsp coarse sea salt (gray salt)
  - 1 tsp freshly ground black pepper
  - 1 egg
  - 1 cup Progresso panko bread crumbs
- Shrimp mixture**
- 16 large uncooked shrimp, peeled (tail shells left on) deveined
  - 1/3 to 1/2 cup extra virgin olive oil
  - 4 cloves garlic, thinly sliced
  - 1 small serrano chile, thinly sliced
  - 1 cup fresh whole basil leaves
  - 1 1/2 tsp grated orange peel
  - Additional extra virgin olive oil
- Directions**
- In small saucepan heat beans, 2 tsp olive oil and the chicken broth to boiling. Reduce heat to low to keep mixture warm. (Lemon juice and parsley will be added later.)
  - In small bowl mix flour, chili powder, 1 tsp salt and 1 tsp pepper. In another small bowl, beat egg lightly. In third small bowl place bread crumbs.
  - Coat shrimp with flour mixture, shaking off excess; next dip shrimp into egg and then coat with bread crumbs. In 10-inch skillet, heat 1/3 cup of oil over high heat. Add shrimp to skillet in single layer. (Do not toss or move shrimp.) Cook about 3 minutes. Turn shrimp over; cook until browned. Remove shrimp from skillet to cookie sheet.
  - Add garlic to hot oil in skillet; cook and stir until light brown, adding more oil if necessary. Add chile; cook until soft. Carefully add basil (water in skillet will pop). Cook 45 to 60 seconds or until crisp.
  - Meanwhile, stir lemon juice and parsley into bean mixture in saucepan; season to taste with additional salt and pepper.
  - Stir orange peel into basil mixture in skillet. Remove from heat. Return shrimp to skillet; toss to combine.
  - Spoon bean mixture onto platter or individual plates; drizzle with olive oil. Top with shrimp; spoon some of basil mixture with some of its oil over top.
- Bon appetit'. Take a nap. You deserve it.

This is the same Pickens dude that wants to sell Panhandle water to folks in Dallas and some Panhandlers are actually going along with it. ## Lakeview School historical marker dedication Sept 21

The Lakeview School historical marker will be dedicated Sunday, September 21, at 2:30 p.m. at the site of the marker. The location is approximately 11 miles southeast of Friona on Highway 2397, County Road 27.

The Lakeview School came into existence in 1928 when the Black School District was divided. Lakeview School consolidated with Friona in 1942. The schoolhouse and teacherage were moved to Friona. The old school house is now located on the east side of the junior high football field along Euclid St.

Ex-students of Lakeview School will share some of the memories of their days spent there. The public is invited to attend the dedication of the Lakeview School marker.

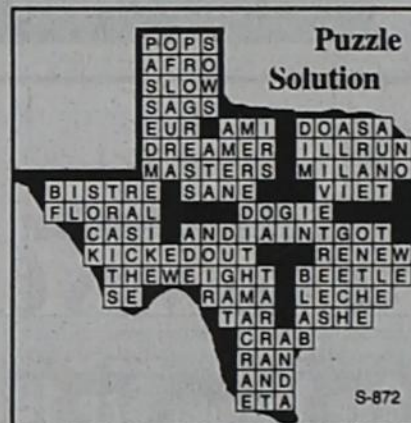

## Food certification course in Hereford

Texas Agrilife Extension will be offering the Food Service Manager Certification Course and testing in Hereford on September 25 - 26.

This is the class that enables food establishments to meet the Texas Board of Health adopted rules to implement the past legislative session statute requiring each food establishment to have one certified food manager.

The 16-hour class will be offered in Hereford on Thursday and Friday, September 25 - 26, from 8 a.m. to 12 and 1 to 5 p.m. both days, in the Nita Lea Building at 903 14th. Testing will begin at 1:00 p.m. and end at 5 p.m. on September 26.

Registration deadline for this class is Tuesday, September 23. Late registration will be accepted at the door as long as space is available. Class size is limited.

To register for certification training, contact the Texas Agrilife Extension office in Deaf Smith County, at 364-3573, to obtain a registration form.

Registration cost for the 2-Day Training is \$89 per person, for the Test Only the cost is \$50 and registration must be done prior to time test is scheduled. Class registration includes participant study guide and test. Test-only registration does not include a study guide.

Food establishments are urged to register immediately in order to be in compliance with State guidelines. Food establishments should complete registration immediately for the class and make a call to the Deaf Smith County Extension office.

## Don't sweat the small stuff?

Jesus put before them another parable: "The Kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed that someone took and sowed in his field; it is the smallest of all the seeds, but when it has grown it is the greatest of shrubs and becomes a tree, so that the birds of the air come and make nests in its branches." —Matthew 13:31

"A parable," writes Frederick Buechner, "is a small story with a large point."

Jesus told stories and parables all the time. In fact, if someone asked him a direct question, nine times out of ten, Jesus told a parable. It is a very effective way of making a point without insulting someone or being condescending.

Parables engage our imagination. Parables do not give easy clear answers, though, and they often startle us. Most of the parables Jesus told were towards the religious leaders (those who wear suits, robes, stoles, albs, and even Hawaiian shirts, i.e., me) and were for the benefit of people who were seen as unfit, cast out, and unworthy. Jesus said very powerful, direct words, which were opposite of parables, to some religious leaders, and those direct, powerful words got him into trouble.

Look at a mustard seed. Whoever thought of comparing a Kingdom to the smallest seed they knew then? People in Jesus' time used to refer to a mustard seed when they spoke of the tiniest possible thing, like we'd talk about a tiny cell in the human body, or an infinitesimal speck of light 12 billion light years away.

What in the world was Jesus saying? Well, since it's a parable, we don't know for sure, but it invites our speculation. Jesus says the Kingdom of God is like: an idea which comes when least expected, a realization where one says, "That's it!", and then one acts even if one is shocked, because amazement, observation, and action can become a reality never pondered.

The Kingdom of God (Heaven) is seen mostly as somewhere or something after we die. Jesus said it is right before our eyes too, and we don't see it. Whose kingdom is your mind on? Caesar's or God's? And, what mustard seed is growing in you?

We moved to Friona in 1969 and have lived here ever since. Don worked for West Friona Grain and I worked for Friona Feedyard. I became pregnant in 1974 so I quit working. On October 27, 1975 my daughter, Susan Ray Huckabee, was born in Hereford, Texas.

Don and I loved to travel! We've been to London, Rome, Hawaii and Old Mexico City.

Don served in the Army and was wounded twice. He was stationed in Korea. He earned the Purple Heart.

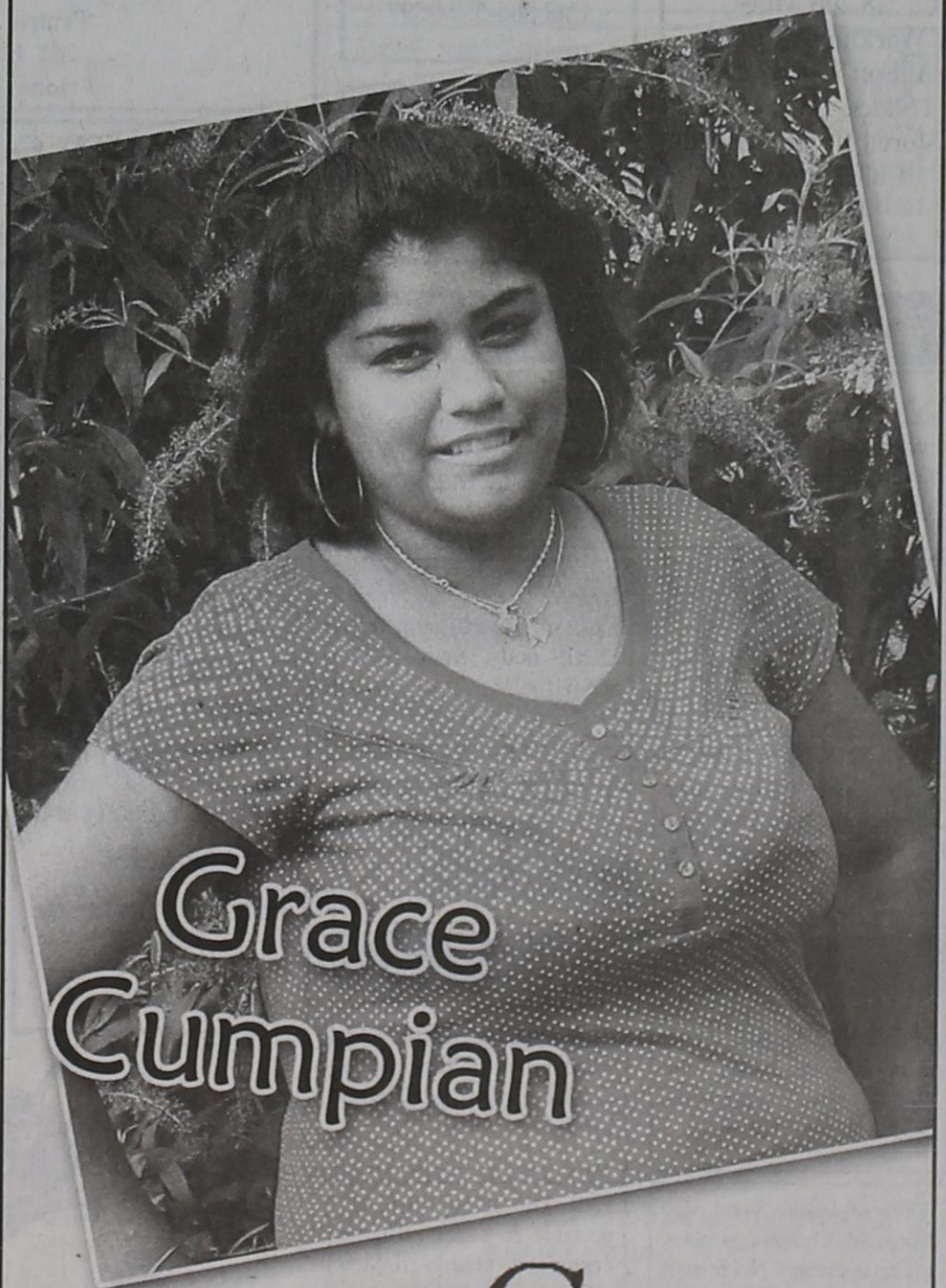

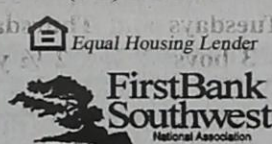

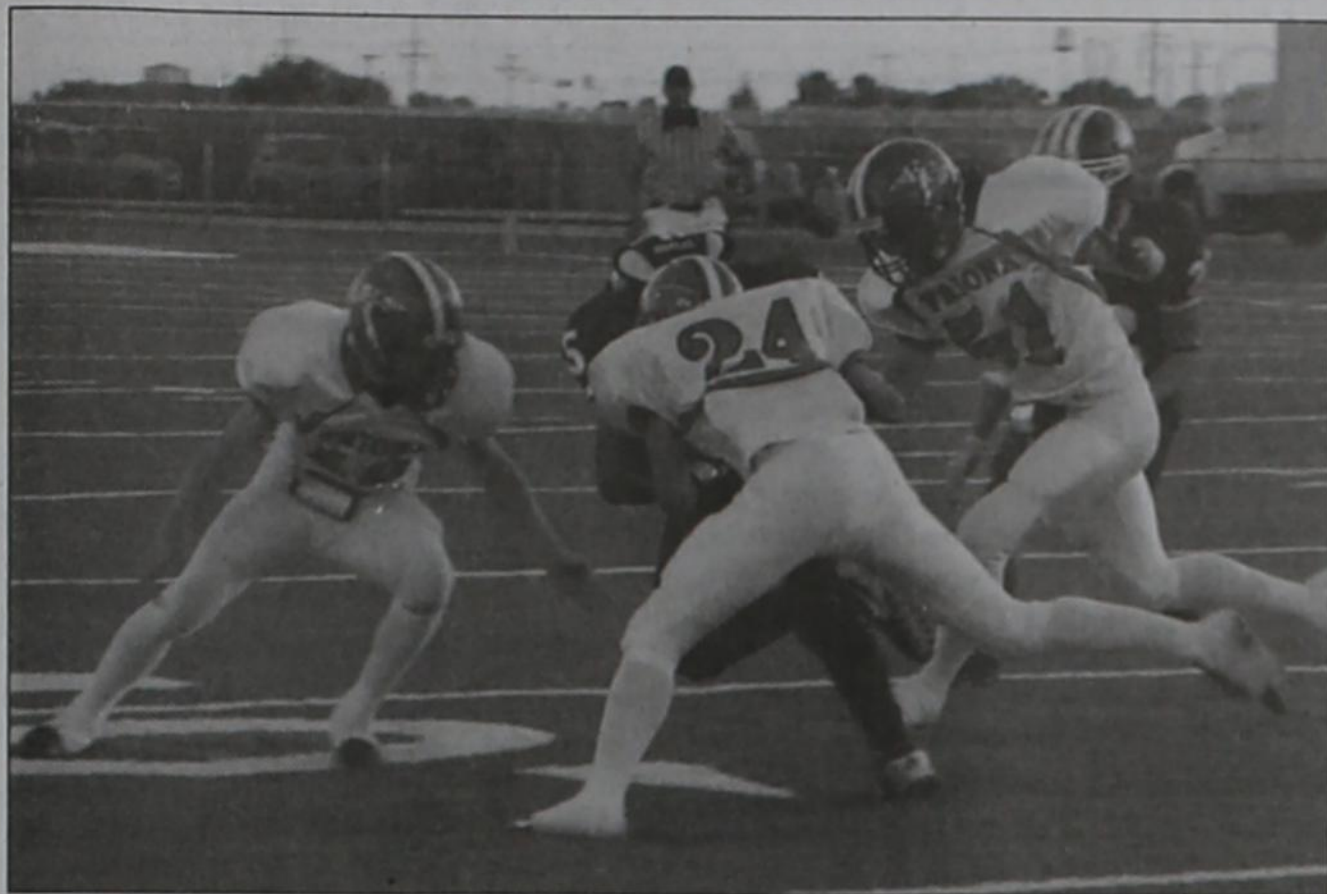

## Wildcats thump the Chieftains 34-6

Injuries and fumbles played a role in the Chieftains non-district loss at Littlefield Friday night. Senior running back and linebacker Raul Licerio sustained an ankle injury in the pregame warmups on the Wildcats' artificial turf and did not play.

Senior lineman Alex Vega was sidelined for part of the game with a shoulder injury but returned to the field, and sophomore running back and defensive back Zack Fair dislocated his right shoulder in the second half and did not return to action.

On the Chiefs first possession they were in a sustained drive when a Chieftain fumble was scooped up by a Wildcat and returned 50+ yards to the Chiefs 3-yard line. Littlefield punched it in from there to take a quick 7-0 lead.

Littlefield scored twice in the 2nd quarter, once on

another 7-yard fumble return for a touchdown, to take a 21-0 halftime lead. The Wildcats scored twice more in the second half and led 34-0 until the Chiefs took advantage of an interference call in the end zone and scored late in the 4th quarter on a Noe Saenz 1-yard run.

The Chiefs put together 190 yards of offense (151 rushing, 39 passing) against the hard hitting Wildcats. Senior back Joey Mendoza was the workhorse with 11 carries for 65 yards. Z. Fair was 4 for 23 yards and returned 2 kickoffs for 32 yards, Jonathan Licerio carried 7 times for 24 yards, Noe Saenz 3 for 6 yards, Ernesto Monreal 3 for 4 yards, and Joey Dickson carried 4 times for 11 yards.

Dickson also completed 4 of 11 passing attempts for 62 yards. Justin Dominguez completed 2 of 7 for 7 yards. Matthew Stanberry caught 2 passes for 29

yards, J. Licerio caught 2 for 23, and David Schwab caught 2 for 7 yards.

Jonathan Licerio got in some punting practice, booting 6 times for 216 yards, an average of 36 yards. His longest punt was 65 yards. The Chieftain defense held the Wildcats to 208 total yards of offense, 158 rushing and 50 passing.

In District 2-2A, Muleshoe leads at 2-0 after crushing Portales 63-35. Childress and Floydada cracked the win column and are now 1-1. Tulia, Dimmitt, and Friona are 0-2. The Chieftains host the River Road Wildcats next. Kickoff is 7:30 p.m. Friday September 12 at Chieftain Field.

The JV Chiefs and Littlefield JV played to a 14-14 tie. Steven Mendoza scored a touchdown and a two-point conversion and Jeremy Alaniz scored a touchdown.

Coach Rex Cumpton said, "The team played a good ball game with a great effort right to the end. Our numbers are a little thin at some positions so these guys do not get a lot of rest, but they always play hard. We go to River Road on Thursday and will be looking for our first victory." The team record is 0-1-1

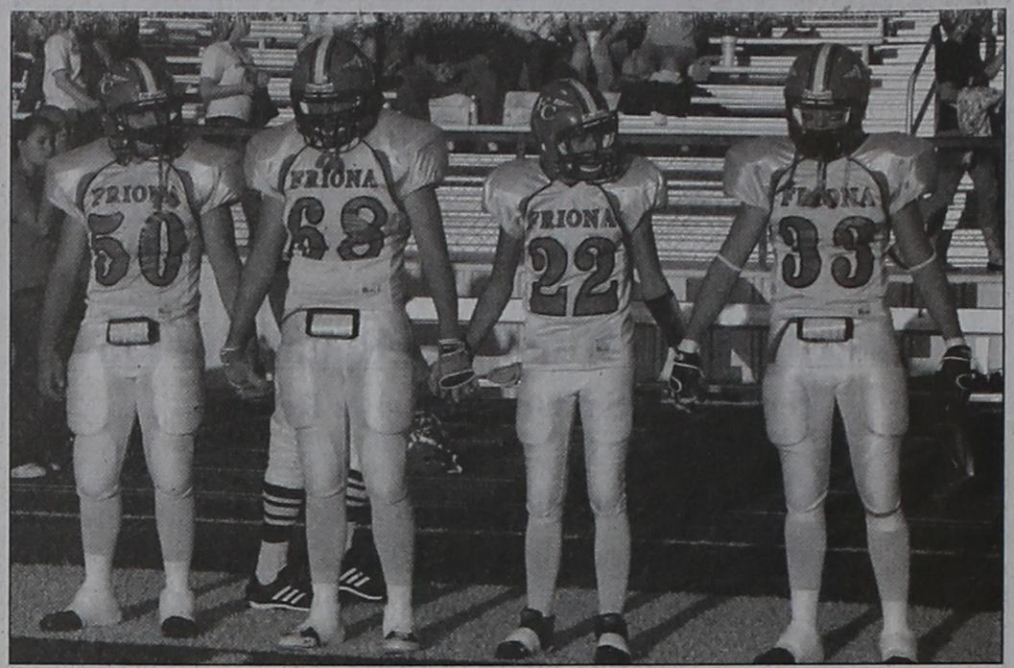
