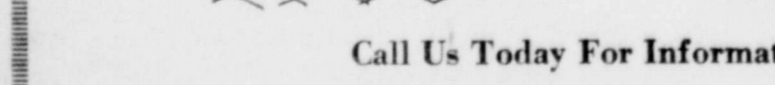

Inspiration for a Holiday Morning



WHEN Christmas guests stay overnight, what are you going to feed them when they tumble downstairs in the morning? If you'll just keep a package of hot roll mix and some spices on hand, you can feed them this festive Christmas Tree Coffee Cake, all spicy and fresh. And if you care to pop it into a hot oven for a few minutes while you're making the coffee, it'll be deliciously warm, too. (You'll have made the bread the day before, of course, so that you, too, can sleep a little later in the morning!)

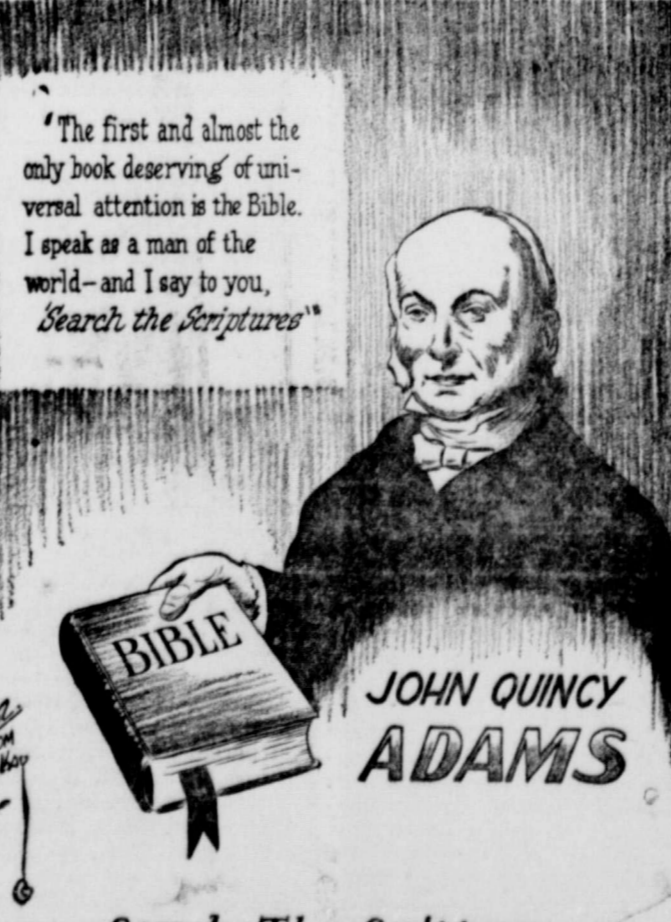
A word about that coffee. Make it in healthy quantities! When you discover how much coffee one of last night's party-goers can put away, you're apt to find yourself humming "How Deep Is The Ocean?" in a slightly dazed fashion. Granted that the song originally described the depth of man's love for a maid, it also refers to the measure of man's love for his coffee!

Chilled orange juice or grapefruit juice, plenty of fresh sweet butter and marmalade or preserve will complete the simple but delectable spread.

CHRISTMAS TREE COFFEE CAKE

Follow recipe for sweet rolls or refrigerator rolls on package of hot roll mix, adding 1 teaspoon cinnamon, 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg and 1/4 teaspoon all-spice to the dry ingredients. After mixing with liquid called for, work in 1/2 cup finely chopped walnuts. Let rise as directed. Shape dough in long rope about 1/2-inch in diameter. Coil rope in shape of Christmas tree, starting with trunk. Brush with melted butter or margarine. Cover and let rise again until doubled in bulk. Bake as directed for rolls. Cool. Decorate with white confectioners' sugar frosting, green sugar and Maraschino cherries.

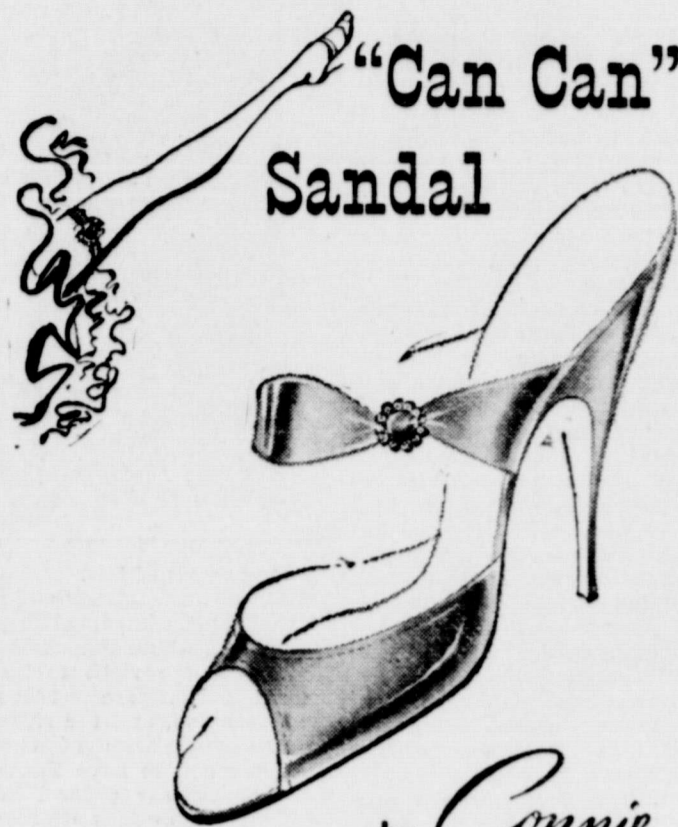

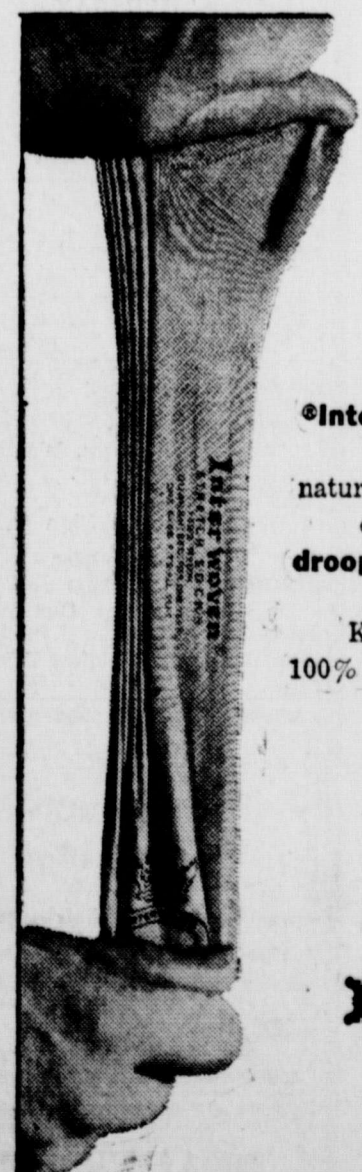

Among the most familiar of our constitutional guarantees are those relating to freedom of religion, speech, and of the press. The same article protects the right of peaceable assembly and the privilege of petitioning the government for redress of grievances.

Another amendment secures our persons, houses, papers and effects against unreasonable searches and seizures, and specifies that no warrants shall issue but upon probable cause, and unless supported by oath or affirmation.

The due process of law amendment encompasses not one but several guarantees. Every American is secured against being placed twice in legal jeopardy for the same offense; against being compelled to be a witness against himself in a criminal case; and against having his private property taken for public use without just compensation.

He is also secured against being held for trial for a capital (death penalty) or other infamous crime, unless upon a presentment or indictment of a grand jury. And, of course, no person may be deprived of life, liberty or property without orderly court procedures.

on due process of law.

The right to a speedy and public trial, by an impartial jury, in the locality where the crime was committed, the right to be informed of the nature and cause of the accusation, and the rights to compel attendance of defense witnesses and to have the assistance of defense counsel in all criminal prosecutions are secured by another section of the "Bill of Rights."

Excessive bail and fines, and cruel and unusual punishments, are prohibited in Amendment VIII. Other articles insure the right to bear arms and ban quartering of soldiers in private homes during peace time.

This, to make quite clear to our governing bodies the underlying intent of the preceding provisions, the Ninth Amendment states: "The enumeration in the Constitution, of certain rights, shall not be construed to deny or disparage others retained by the people."

The Tenth Amendment further emphasizes this basic theory by providing: "The powers not delegated to the United States by the Constitution, nor prohibited by it to the States, are reserved to the States respectively, or to the people."

This, that fundamental philosophy expressed in the Declaration of Independence, that men are endowed with certain unalienable rights, and that "to secure these rights, governments are instituted among men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed," has been carried forward into the highest law of our land.

During the War of 1812, Stephen Girard, Philadelphia banker, assumed an entire Government loan of \$5,000,000.

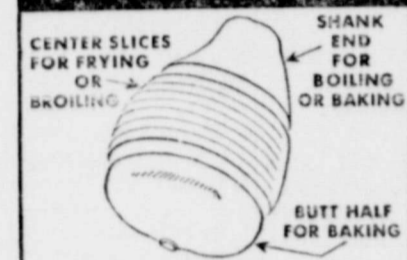

Tuberculosis Is Losing Ground As Death Cause

AUSTIN, Dec. 16. — Tuberculosis, many years ago the nation's leading cause of death, is losing out because of man's fight for better health. Once the leading death in Texas, too, tuberculosis now ranks ninth in Texas as a cause of death, says Dr. Henry A. Holle, State Health Officer. Last year all forms of tuberculosis killed 1,070 Texans while twenty years ago with a population of only two-thirds of our present population there were 4,020 deaths.

Tuberculosis usually attacks the lungs. The disease is spread from person to person, through germ-laden droplets or sputum discharged by an infected person. It can be spread through kissing, breathing air containing tuberculosis germs, and through handling objects used in common with tuberculous persons. Children are easily susceptible to tuberculosis infection, as they are to other disease germs.

Tuberculosis victims have a good chance to recover, if the disease is found in its early stages, and the physician's instructions for treatment are carefully followed. The outlook is becoming more encouraging as time goes on, but we cannot rest while the disease is still taking so many lives.

Often, tuberculosis does not show any noticeable symptoms until its victim has become extremely sick. The most common signs are chronic indigestion, steady loss of weight, an irritating hoarseness, poor appetite, and a constant feeling of fatigue, without any apparent cause for it. The warnings are more definite when a persistent cough appears, or when a person begins spitting blood or blood streaked sputum, feels persistent or recurring pains in the chest, or runs daily fever in the afternoon.

If you experience any of these symptoms, don't delay — see your physician. One or more of these symptoms may or may not mean tuberculosis, but it is best to learn the cause. Don't try to diagnose your own condition, let your physician do it, and follow his advice.

A regular chest x-ray is the surest way to detect early tuberculosis. Every Texan has an opportunity to have his chest x-rayed by one of the mobile x-ray units operated by the Texas State Department of Health.

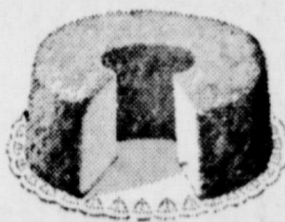

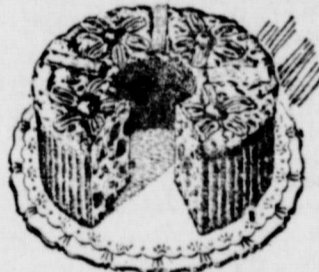

**San Antonio Man
Tells Of Killing
King Of All Bucks**

AUSTIN, Dec. 15. — How he hunted and bagged the world's record white-tailed buck trophy is described by Henderson Coquat of San Antonio in the coming December issue of Texas Game and Fish Magazine.

The giant white-tailed, officially recognized by the Boone and Crockett Club, had a rack spread of 27 inches. It was taken in Webb County in deep South Texas in the fall of 1949 but it was not formally designated as the king of the white tails until last March.

Coquat bought the scene of the historic harvest—the Old Apache Ranch—from the government in the fall of 1948. The ranch, on the east bank of the Rio Grande about fifty miles north of Laredo, was part of a bombing range during the last war. It bore so much shooting evidence that the new owner said he doubted "that much game had survived the mighty bombardments of our eager young pilots."

The champion went on in his narrative: "But I had not given full credit to the cunning and the courage of the whitetail. Not only had a goodly number of them survived, but they had learned what a man with a gun meant, and how to outwit him."

Coquat related how he had become increasingly intrigued by the tall tales brought back by his guests who referred to the enchanted bucks "with rocking chair-like heads that stared them into inaction."

Here is Coquat's own description of the climax to his quest: "I was alert and quick in feeling that a huge-ghostly, gray deer was threading his way through the chaparral and cactus about 200 yards away. He may have been sneaking through the chaparral and cactus about 200 yards away . . . but whatever his business, he sensed my presence just as I sensed his, and started in the opposite direction with that quick, crazy, dodging motion that has saved the lives of millions of his kind."

"But I had seen his horns and realized in that millionth of a second that he was the deer I had hunted all my life. All the years of hunting experience, and all the hunters' instinct, surged up in me in that flashing moment, and my 250 began to talk. The first two shots had hollow sounds, and I knew they had not touched him. Then just the right shot showed at just the right instant, and the touch of the trigger was synchronized as happens in the best (or the luckiest) of shots. The crack of the rifle was followed by the thud of the bullet that said success. Down went the great rack of horns, and all was quiet except my pounding heart."

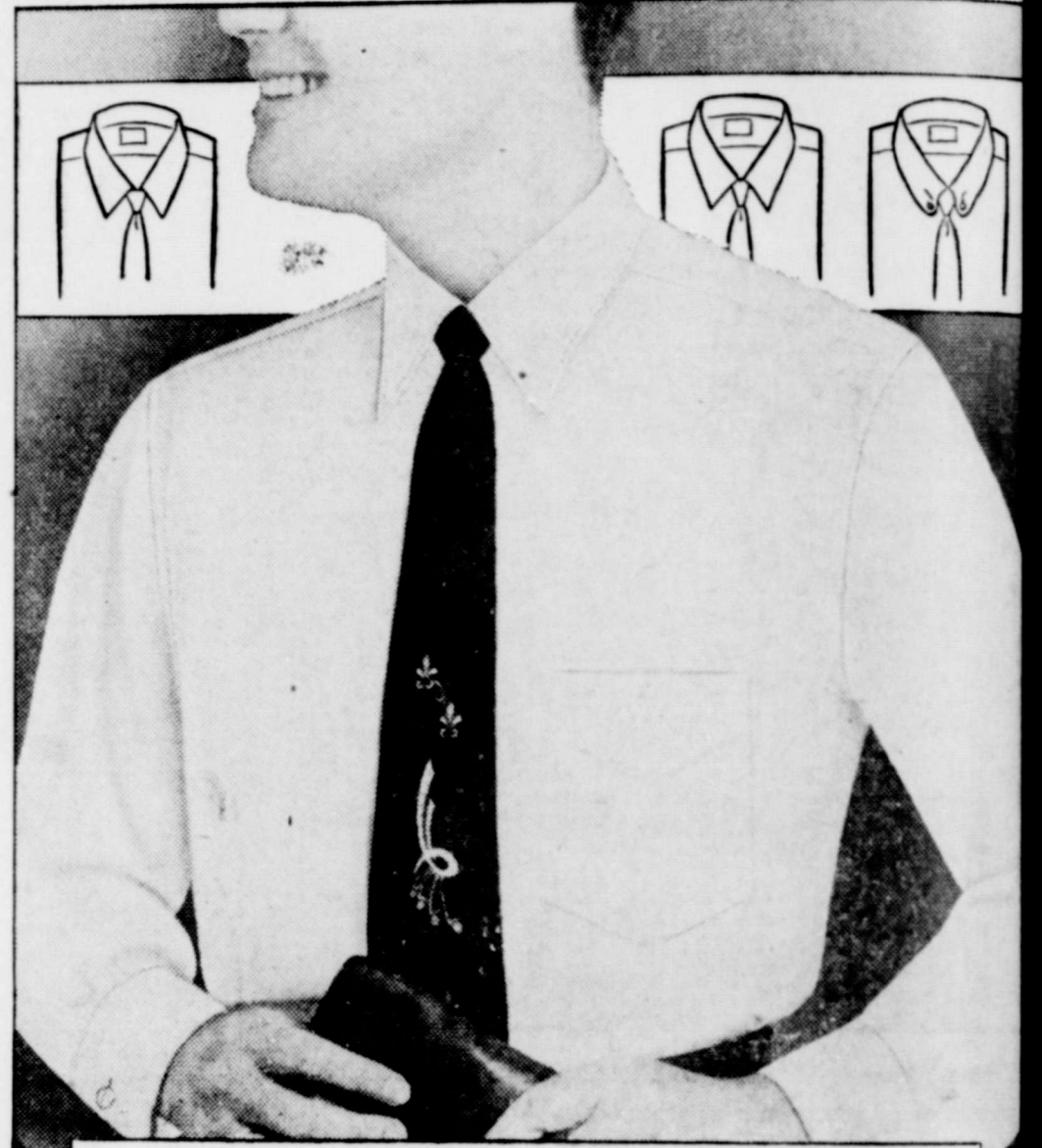

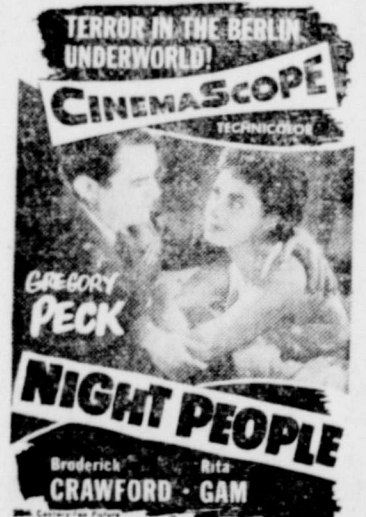

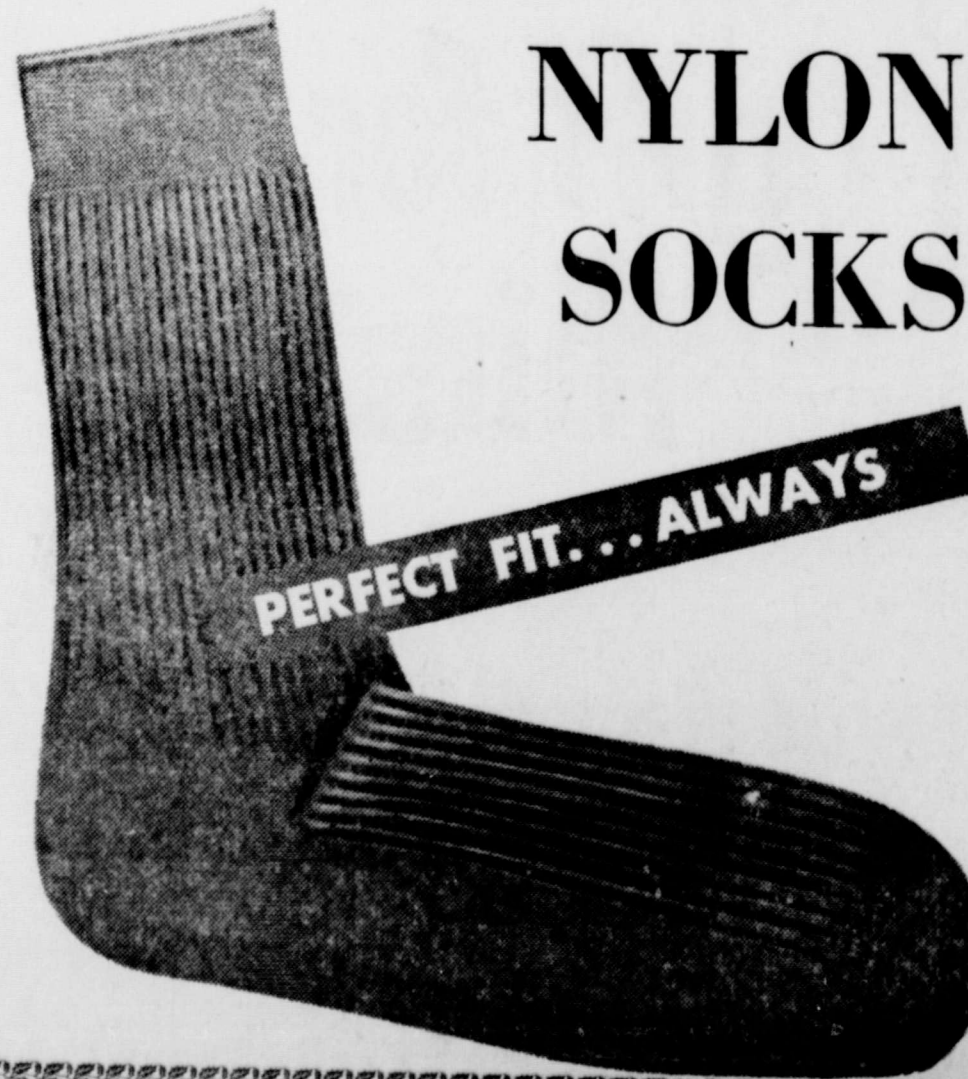
