We have inveatigated 71 felony charges and quite a number of miademeanors. We have returned 30 indictmonts for felonies and 7 indiotments for miedemeanore. We have made diligent inquiry into all matters coming to our attention, and have returned indictmente against all parties when we thought indictmente ohould be returned. Wa haye thought best to refer some matiers coming before us to the next grand jury, and this we have done, be lieving it to be to the best inter est of all parties so to do, and not because of any desire to shirk our duty. We have examined the jail and find it in good condition. We suggeat that it the Commissioners' Court takee up the matter of adjuating matters in reference to road service that they qo back as far as 1903 , or to the taking effect of the Houston County Spacial Road Law, enacied by the legielature of 1903, coumonly known as the Stokes Road Law, and not for a period of one year only. We de sire to thank the diatrict and ful attendanoe with us, and fo much valuable assietance ered us during our labors. We aleo destre to thank the door bailiff for faithful attendance, and liur riding bailiffa for efficient service renderud. As we haye finished our labore, wo now aek that we be pormitted to adjourn
