## A NEW SCHOOL BUILDING?

For a few days our citizens become very much enthused over the idea of building a new school house, and it was discussed pro and con for several days. Here of late we do not here much of it. The plan was to issue bonds for a \$10,000 brick building, but after an investigation it is found that the taxable property in the school district is not sufficient to warrant the issue of bonds for this amount. This has had a tendency to cool us off a bit, but we should not become discouraged. It is not necessary to erect a \$10,000 brick building. We believe we have a plan which will be much cheaper and answer the purpose as well. We believe a concrete building can be built for at least one third the cost of a brick, or probably cheaper, for we have the material right here on the ground to make the concrete. We believe it is the duty of the school board to figure on the cost of a concrete building and see whether or not we could issue bonds for such a structure. That we need a new school building no one will dispute. Within the past few years our school has grown from two teachers to five and the school board thinks it will be necessary to employ another for next term. Where will they put the next one? The present quarters are inadequate for the teachers we have. We want to enter an earnest plea for a new school building and want to go on record as favoring one built of concrete. Let us not become discouraged but get down to business and figure on the cost.

You can count on the Messenger being in favor of any proposition that will have a tendency to build up our town and country. We are for Grapeland country first, last and all the time, the world afterwards.

It is said that Hon. T. M. Campbell is thinking seriously of making an effort to become governor of Texas for the third time. We have not given this a very serious thought but on the spur of the moment we think Tom had better retire to private life for a while at least.

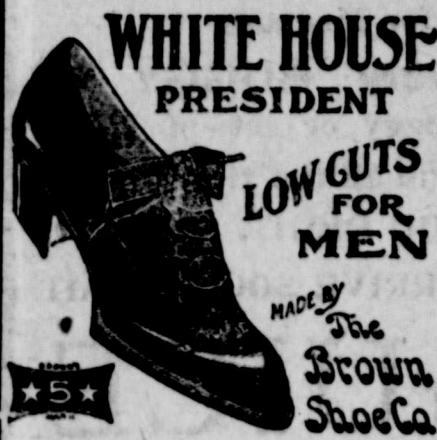
