Crockett, Texas, July 9.-The Grady Oil and Gas Co., Inc., an Oklahoma corporation that took over the leases and holdings of the Houston County Oil & Gas Co., east of this city several weeks ago, will commence operations July 15. They will first sink deeper and test out a well abandoned, and will then sink a number of test wells. An experienced operator from the Oklahoma fields will supervise operations and new and improved machinery will be used.





LIFE IN THE NAVY

Norfolk, Va. Grapeland Messenger, and the Good People of Grapeland:

As it has been some time since I left I will now try to fulfill the promise that I made several of you when I enlisted in the navy.

I went to Houston and signed up when I left Grapeland and went home to await orders. I went to West Texas and was with my baby girl for a day or two, then went to Brady and visited my people there. I was only there four days when I was called out. We all were called to Houston on the 11th of Junefifty firemen. We left Houston on the night of the 11th over the Gulf Coast Lines via Beaumont, Batan Rouge, thence to New Orleans, La., where we had two hours to get breakfast and have our two pullman cars transferred to another depot. Then we went to Atlanta, Ga., where we stopped over about an hour. Leaving Atlanta, we went thru the States of South and North Carolina, then into Danville, Va., where we laid over for 10 hours; then came in to Norfolk, where we were taken into a boat and carried out to the training camp. And believe me, we had some fine trip. But we were all glad to reach our destination. After landing in the training camp we drew part of our clothes, took a shower bath and then went to the mess hall and ate dinner. That was the 14th of June. After dinner we drew our hammocks and mattresses, blankets and some more clothes and had them all branded. We were all vaccinated and turned loose for the rest of the day.

The next day we were assigned to a company and quarters and started to drilling. After a couple of days we were given the typhoid fever antitoxin. After we stayed in that camp a week we were moved to another camp, where we have better accommodations. And later we will be moved to the main camp and be given liberty when off duty. We have the Y. M. C. A. at our disposal from 3 p. m. to 8:30 p. m., where we have all kinds of games, reading matter, pens, paper and ink, piano and Victrola, so we can pass the time off fairly well when we are not on duty.

We get up at 5 o'clock and answer roll call at 5:30. My company goes to breakfast at 6:00. The mess hall is a large stone building where only a few eat at a time-anywhere from twelve to fourteen hundred. They have to serve three meals to feed all in this camp. There are over 100 waiters in the Mess Hall. These waiters are taken out of the different companies and serve a week at a time, then another bunch goes in for the next week. I have missed the Mess Hall so far. They have had me guarding the clothes line, which is just a job of sitting around. The hardest work I have had to do for a week is to walk about 250 yards to my

meals. Each and every man has to wash his own clothes and it sure gets next to some of the city 'sissies" who didn't know a piece of laundry soap from a the navy. After you wash and dry your clothes you fold them up and roll them up in a way that they look like they have been ironed. We have picture shows twice a week. Our feed is fairly good, could be better though, but as crowded as
