Watertown, Wis., Aug. 15, 1917 Editor Messenger:
Mazon is the name of a little town of about 1000 population, located on the Santa Fe railroad, about 65 miles south of Chicago, and it claims to have more Red Cross members than any other town in the United States per population. All honor to Mazon! The Red Cross is not a woman's organization but most of the members are women and a great and good work they are doing. Sad to relate, but true, a report has gone abroad in the country that the lady members are subject to and liable to be drafted to serve in the war as nurses and do other work of a similiar nature. Nothing could be farther from the truth. People who repeat such as true are no better than the men who tried to prevent registration of men. Every girl 12 years old, and every lady who is enjoying the protection of the government of the United States and who is proud of the stars and stripes, ought to be a
member of the Red Corss, and particularly so just now and until peace is establilshed. I would no more try to keep my wife, mother, or sister from being a momber of the Red Cross Society than I would to get out and make speeches against the government. This is about the most serious time the United States has seen in many years and I am hoping that it will soon be over.
