A slide presentation on the graduates is under the direction of Julie Brown, Lory Tannahill, Toni Chapman, Nina Constancio, Louis Dunnam and Tonya Potts.

Miss Snead, class president, will present the class gift. Superintendent Hal Ratcliff will make a special presentation.

Ratcliff, principal Cliff Stephens, assisted by board members Danny Black, Butch Preston and Dee Willard, will present the diplomas.

The invocation will be by Bill White, and benediction by Lupita Rocha.

Claudia Hanes at the piano and Clint Mears at the synthesizer, will play "Processional" and "Recessional."

Graduate Prize List Worth Over \$3,000

The prize list for FHS graduates at the all-night party planned following graduation topped the \$3,000 mark, with some nice prizes being offered, it was announced this week.

Kathryn Goddard, Chamber of Commerce manager, who has been in charge of the prizes, said they will include the following:

Entertainment packages with gas, meals, movie tickets; color television sets; answering machines; telephones; stereos, gift certificates for boys and girls; and tanning time.

The grand prize will be a trip to San Antonio on American Airlines, with free lodging and tickets to Sea World.

Termed an "alcohol, drug-free" party, the event is designed to provide a wholesome event for the graduates.

In addition, it is expected that the party will be held at the Friona High School gymnasium. Included will be music, volleyball, ping-pong, games, movies, and food-food-food."

A special breakfast will be served at 5 a.m.

Sponsored by the Citizens of Friona, the event gained impetus by a \$500 donation by the Chamber of Commerce toward the event.

Grand Prize to be awarded at 5 a.m.

The grand prize will be a round-trip for two on American Airlines to a Texas city, and to be eligible, graduates must have been at the party continuously.

"Once a person leaves, they will not be allowed to return to the party," said one of the organizers.

The event will be supervised, and will be for graduates and their guests.

Any local resident who would like to donate money or prizes for the party is requested to contact the Chamber office.

"Many communities have sponsored this type of event on graduation night, and we hope that this will be a success, and will become an annual affair," said Kathryn Goddard, for the party organizers.

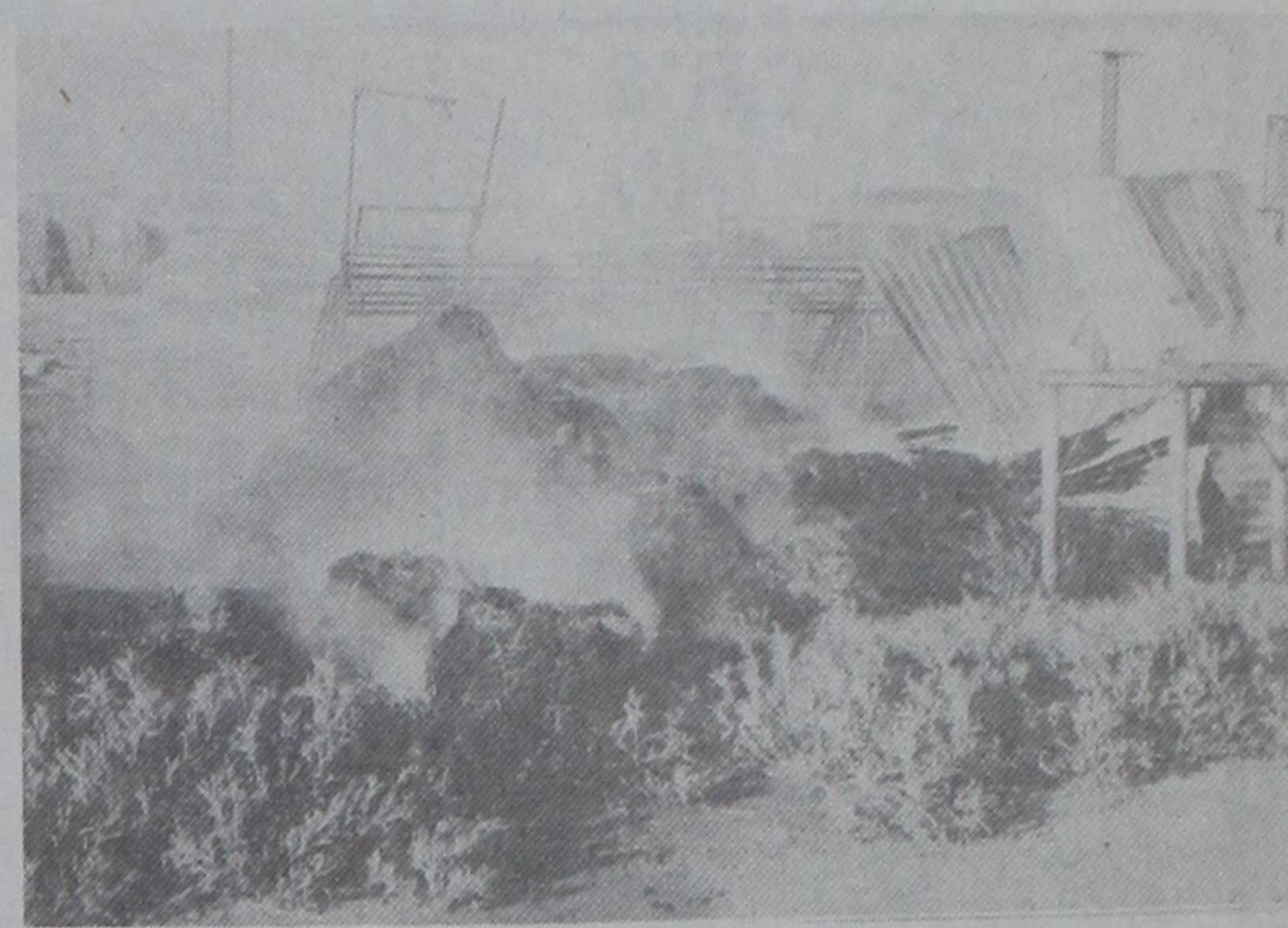

She and her husband, Joe Kyle, live in Shallowater. He is the son

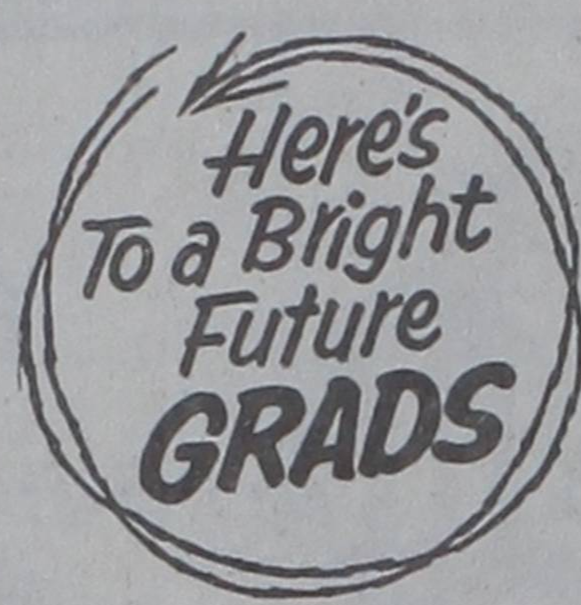

Glenda Ellis Graduates With Honors

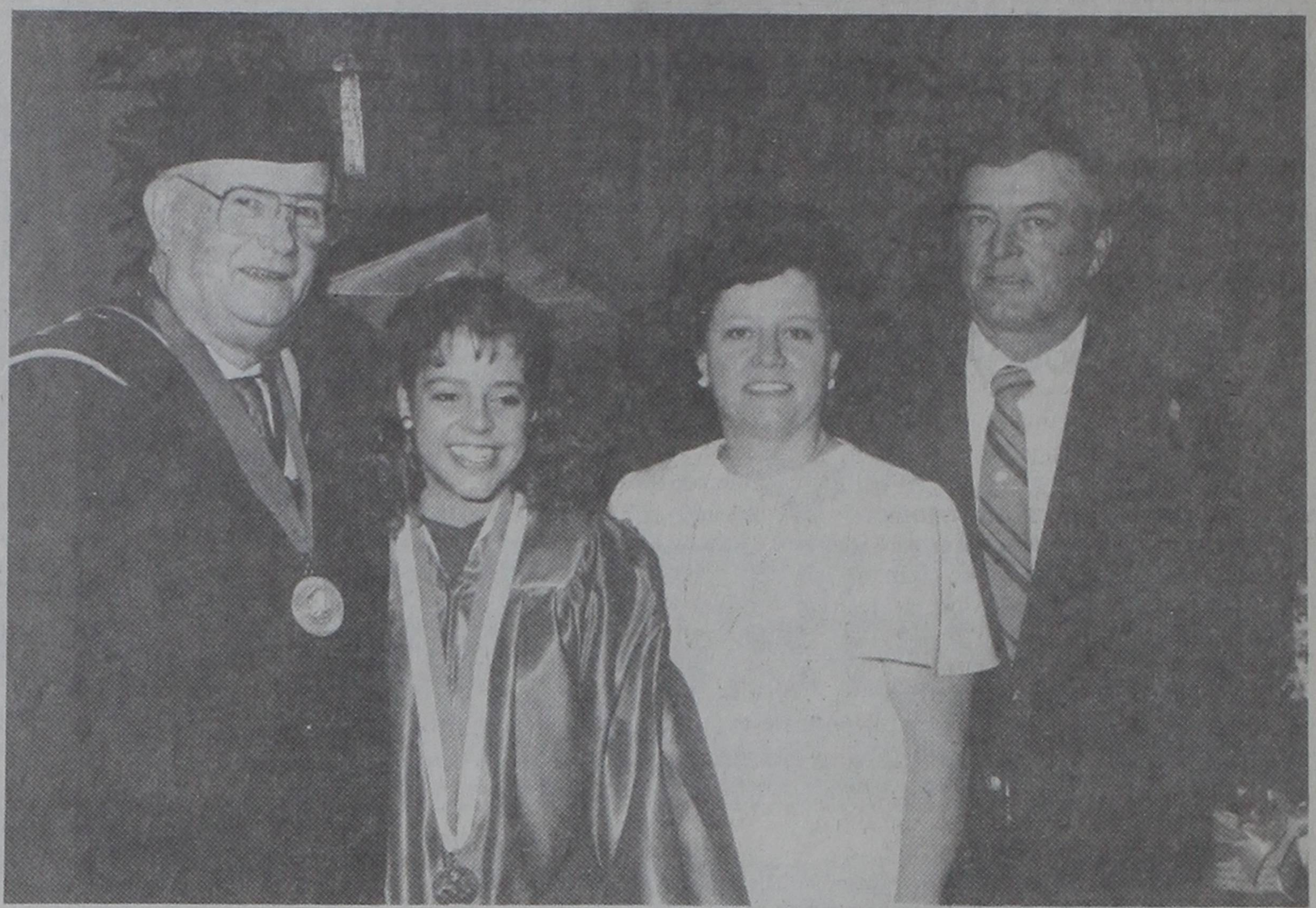
A record number 667 students received diplomas Friday, May 12 during South Plains College's 31st graduation exercises in Texan Dome.

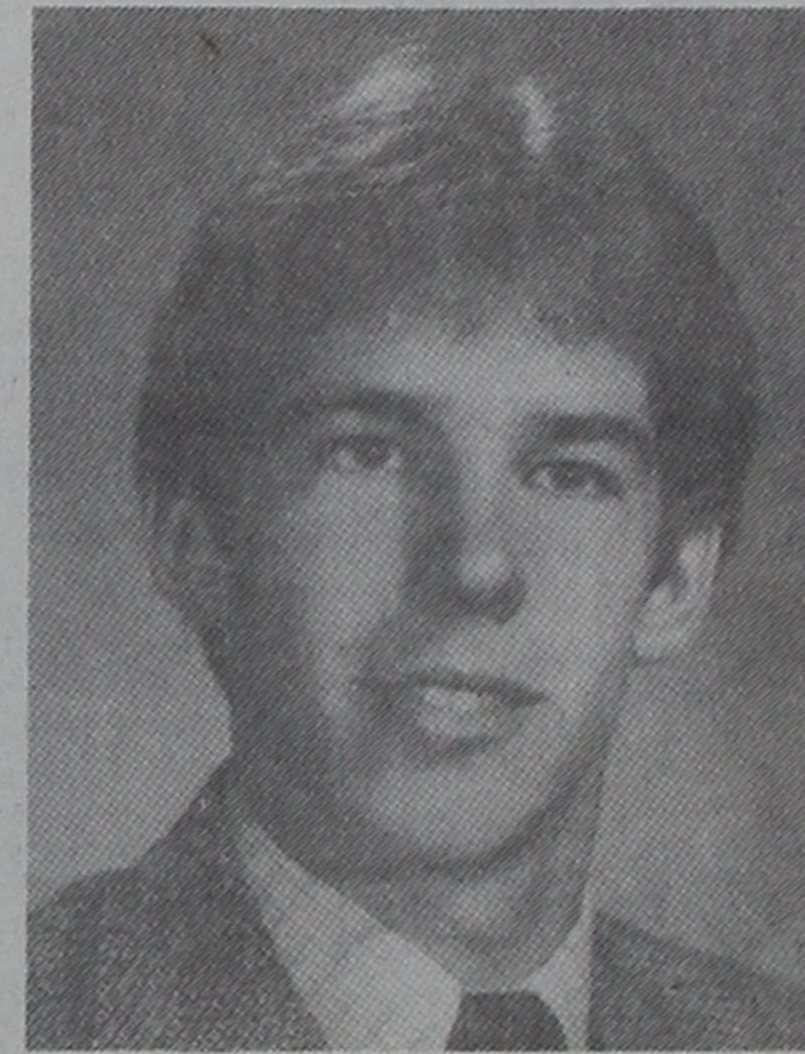

He is a 1977 graduate of Friona High School.

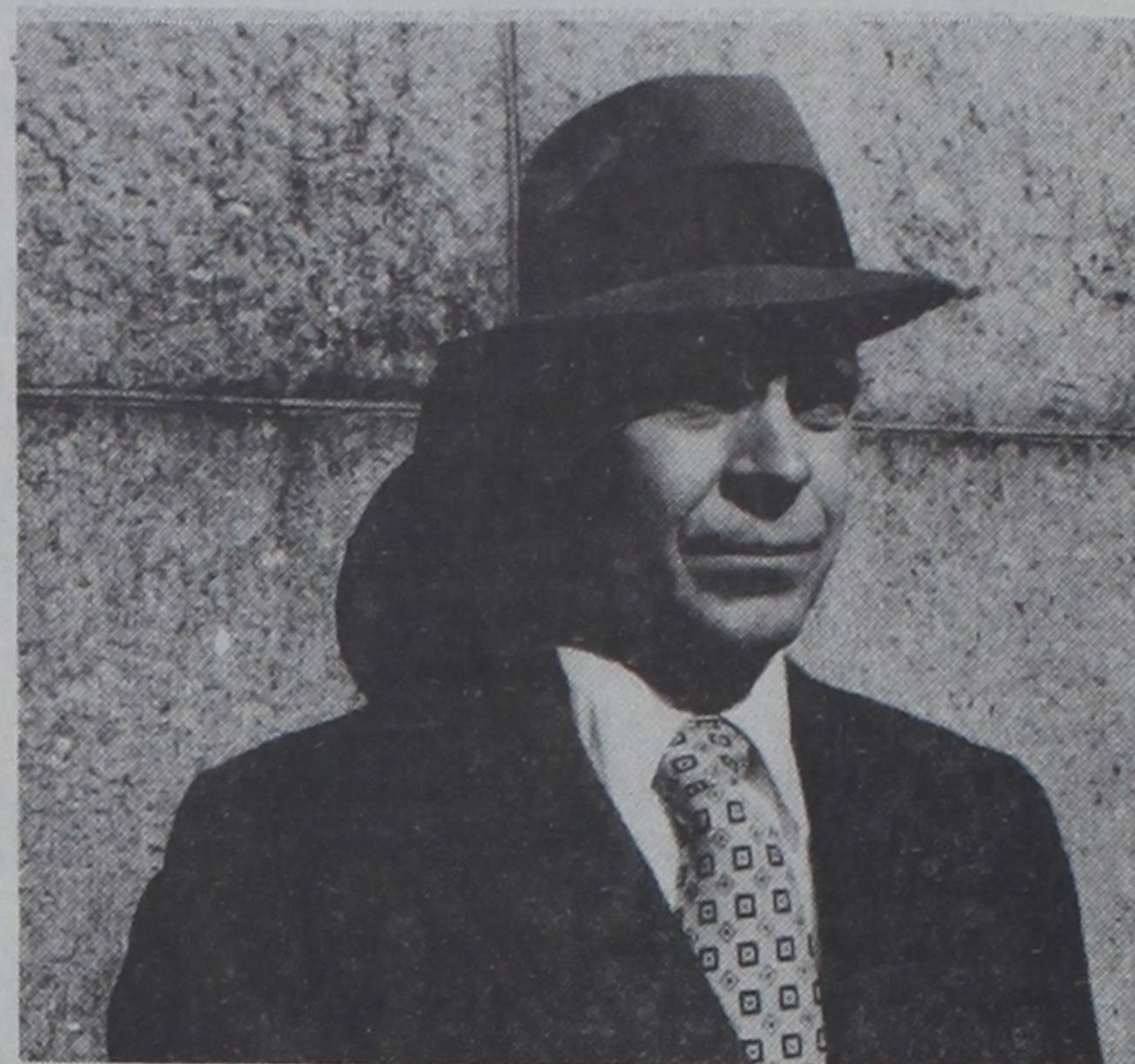
Salesman Confesses

Claims newspaper is best salesman

On Monday, Jules Wintner, owner of a local retail establishment, confessed his job as a salesman was obsolete due to the impact of newspaper advertising. Wintner, in an exclusive interview, said sales were made in the local paper instead of in the store.

"Sure, we get a chance for additional sales," Wintner commented, "but the newspaper has become our best salesman." Wintner reported that consumers name the local newspaper as their usual source of "Best Buy" information, 10 times more than radio or television. This conforms with a recent Consumer Data Service report that indicated 60% of the consumers seek "Best Buy" information from the newspaper versus only 6% for radio and 7% for television.

Wintner later remarked that because the newspaper is read by all Texans, regardless of income, his business was able to sell both upper end products as well as value priced items. "No matter what we're selling, we get good response in the newspaper," he said. "In fact, the more expensive the product, the better our response seems to be." This fact is substantiated in a survey by the Texas Newspaper Advertising Bureau that documented readership of the newspaper increases as income increases. In the survey, almost 75% of Texans with incomes exceeding \$50,000 a year read

the newspaper.

"My job has become redundant," Wintner admitted. "Used to be I had to really sell each customer, but now I'm just an order taker." Asked what he intended to do now that the newspaper was doing most of the selling, he replied, "Spend more in newspaper advertising than last year."

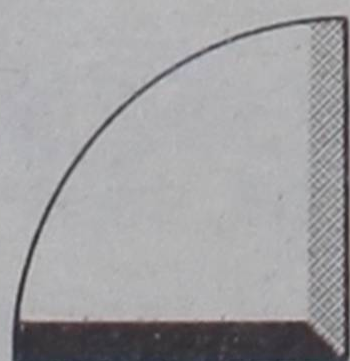
