BELGIAN KING PINS MORE MEDALS ON LINDY.

BRUSSELS, Belgium, May 28.-Finishing a successful flight from Paris with a bit of an aerial flourish, Capt. Charles A. Lindbergh arrived here this afternoon. He swept out of the clouds over the flying field at 3:10 p. m. and a few seconds later made a perfect landing. Belgium gave its highest honor to Lindbergh, "America's unofficial flying ambassador" this evening. King Albert receiving ace, pinned the decoration of the Order of Leopold upon him and made him a chevalier. He received the honor with some embarrassment and confusion. not as a personal tribute but as an honor to his country.

"I am happy to congratulate you." King Albert said. 'You are now covered with immortal glory and are an example to the human race of what a man can accomplish through having enough confidence in himself.
