ST. JOHNS, N. F., June 4.-The monoplane of Chamberlain and Levine, bound from New York to an unknown destination in Europe passed over St. Shotts at 5:47 this evening, New York time. The plane was heading in an easterly direction and was enjoying almost ideal fly-

When Chamberlain was sighted over St. Shotts, he had coveed apparently 1150 miles, with an aveage speed of 97.8 miles an hour for the entire distance. This would indicate Chamberlain had speeded up his motor since passing Halifax, when he had averaged only 70 miles an

#### HITCH-HIKING DELINQUENTS

All over the country, it is reported, the problem of the run-away child is becoming more serious than ever before. The wanderlust that starts boys and girls away from home without funds, without experience, without adequate preparation, is not new. There have long been children with restless feet. The new phase of the problem, which greatly increases the danger, is the development of hitch-hiking. With the aid of kindly motorists, youngsters are often picked up early in their flight and carried much farther in less time and with less effort to themselves than in the days when they traveled chiefly by trudging. Most of the time it is only kindly generosity that causes a motorist to stop his car and tell the kids to jump in and have a lift. But it is a thoughtless generosity that is too often harmful in the end. If hitchhiking were not so easy, fewer youngsters would find themselves so quickly far from home, hungry, shelterless, driven to begging and tempted to crime. Many a motorist hates to appear selfish and to pass by the kids that ask for a lift. But more times than he realiezs he would be doing them a greater kindness by denying their appeal than by giving them a ride.
