The normal amount of current is so small that any drain makes a difference in volume and quality of transmission. "A single leaf, wet from a summer's night, touching our wires, might, and many of them would, make your message calling the doctor unintelligible to him. A branch falling into the wires may interrupt a message to you that has successfully traveled thousands of miles.' For these and similar reasons, the telephone company has to trim trees, to give good service. The company says it has adopted as standard practice the most modern tree methods, and it asks property owners to follow the same methods, thus preserving the trees and telephone service both. Explanations of this sort from public utility companies are very valuable. They prevent many of the petty bickerings between customers and members of the company in positions where no discretion can be permitted. They create better feeling between customer and company, and enable them to cooperate with each other for the common good.






