

The doctors concluded that the child had been infected from the Teddy bear. Disease germs seldom live for 15 years. Most of them, perhaps, live not more than a few days when exposed to the air outside of the human body. But some kinds are very hardy, and one can never be sure about the others. The only safe procedure is to disinfect or burn everything in contact with patients suffering from communicable diseases.

#### OIL ETHICS.

The petroleum industry for several years has been running wild. It has been every producer and distributor for himself, without regard to the interests of the industry or the public. Now there is a searious effort to stop that. The American Petroleum Institute is working on a "Petroleum Industry Code nof Ethics" to eliminate the chaotic and unprofitable practices which have resulted from the scramble for huncontrolled production. It is expected that this code will be submitted for approval to the federal trade commission and the department of justice. If satisdifactory to them, and recommended by them, it will then have powerful sanction throughout the industry. The Ohio Petroleum Marketers' association has already adopted a code, agreed to by 500 members. Colorado and Virginia have taken similar action.
