### Central West Operators Turn Attention to Developments in Jones, Shackelford Counties

BILENE, July 16.—Attention of operators in the Central West has been directed to developments in the southwestern Jones and Shackelford counties during the past week. Jones county, with its recently completed 1 of Hucny Gas company-Aten & Sandefer, on the verge of production either as producers or as leaseholders, has attracted attention with a test two miles east of Noodle Creek within a few hours drilling of the depth at which the operators expect to pick up the 2,500-foot Joe Winter lime. The Phillips Petroleum company's failure to find production below 4,900 feet in their No. 5 Joe Winter, has been the center of the stage.

However, Shackelford county has been close behind. The showings by Phillips & Dewitt's No. 1 V. & R. A. Davis, located in western part of that county has attracted considerable of a leasing and a number of deals have been reported along with the resumption of drilling on a test in that territory that has been inactive for several weeks.

Fisher county, Cranfill & Reynolds No. 1 Williamson in section 19, is giving the operators another to watch, for it is approaching a depth at which interesting developments are expected, being at least report, drilling around 2,000 feet with the pay found about a mile northwest in the same section No. 1 Young, due at approximately 2,100 feet.
