SHIP TO-SHORE PLANES.

A little more than a year ago, Clarence Chamberlin, one of the successful Atlantic flyers, took off from a specially made runway on the deck of the Leviathan and flew to shore. On August 13, this year, an airplane was hurled by a catapult from the deck of the French liner, Ile de France, 450 miles away from New York. The plane came into New York 18 hours ahead of the steamer. This marked the beginning of regular ship-to-shore airplane service to be offered by the Ile de France on both east and west journeys hereafter. For a while only mail will be so speeded up. Eventually the airplanes will take passengers as well as mail. Later on, too, they will leave the ship farther ! from port, thus gaining a whole day or more in time.

From these beginnings, it is easy to foresee a notfar-distant time when a plane will leave port a day later than a boat, overtake the vessel in mid-ocean, deposit passengers or important mail and be ready to take off again near the other end of the trip, saving two whole days or more for any person or mail that needs to get across in the least possible time.

WOMEN'S POLITICAL FAULTS.

In a magazine article on women in politics, Mussolini says many things which may be regarded by the fair sex as quite unwarranted. For example, he says:

Women in parliament are meddlers and muddlers. They will change their minds a half dozen times during the voting of one bill. They have few political thoughts of their own and are quite likely to vote for a measure simply because the man backing it has curly hair and nice eyes.'

Without going into the matter of whether men ever change their minds, for good reasons or otherwise, and without asking whether any of them ever vote for or against any bill for any reasons except its actual merits, one feels safe in saying that Il Duce's remarks are too sweeping and inclusive to be true. Some women, like some men, may act wholly from prejudice, whim and personal bias. Other women,
