## Suspect Arraigned On

Attempted Murder Charge

The Hansford County Sheriff's Dept. and city police ; were called to the W.E. Jones residence at 204 Townsend in Spearman at 8 p. m. Saturday evening to investigate a shooting. William Eric Jones, 49 years old had been shot 3 times. Mrs. Willie Lee Jones, also 49 years old, and the wife of William Eric Jones, was held as the suspect in the shooting.
Officers stated that Jones had been shot on the right side of his chin, with the bullet coming out a point just below his right ear; also, he had been shot in the left shoulder with the bullet exiting out the left shoulder; the third bullet entered the abdomen, 1 1/2 inches above and 1 inch to the left of the navel, and exiting to the rear of his right side. The intestine was punctured 5 or 6 times. He was rushed to Hansford Hospital where the attending physician worked some $31 / 2$ hours to save the victim, whose condition is termed critical as of Monday.
City officer Bingham, Deputy McFarlin and Sheriff J. B. Cooke met at the apartment of Harbert Clark, just behind the house at 204 Townsend to investigate the shooting.
No motive for the shooting was given and it can only be assumed that all concerned were drinking, and the problem stemmed from "too much" liquor.
The suspect, Mrs. Willie Jones was arraigned and charged for "attempt to murder, with malice aforethought." She was released on $\$ 7500.00$ bond.
Officers surmised that Mrs. Jones shot 4 or 5 times, with an Italian made .25 caliber pistol, hitting the victim three times.
