Suspect Arraigned On

Attempted Murder Charge

The Hansford County Sheriff's Dept. and city police ; were called to the W.E. Jones residence at 204 Townsend in Spearman at 8 p.m. Saturday evening to investigate a shooting. William Eric Jones, 49 years old had been shot 3 times. Mrs. Willie Lee Jones, also 49 years old, and the wife of William Eric Jones, was held as the suspect in the shooting. Officers stated that Jones had been shot on the right side of his chin, with the bullet coming out a point just below his right ear; also, he had been shot in the left shoulder with the bullet exiting out the left shoulder; the third bullet entered the abdomen, 1 1/2 inches above and 1 inch to the left of the navel, and exiting to the rear of his right side. The intestine was punctured 5 or 6 times. He was rushed to Hansford Hospital where the attending physician worked some 3 1/2 hours to save the victim, whose condition is termed critical as of Monday. City officer Bingham, Deputy Mc-Farlin and Sheriff J.B. Cooke met at the apartment of Harbert Clark, just behind the house at 204 Townsend to investigate the shooting.





In School District

The school census for the 1970-71 year is underway in Spearman Independent School district according to Supt. James Cunningham.

State law requires that all youths who will be six years of age and those who will be 18 or less on September 1, 1970 be listed in the school census, whether they are in school ornot. All must be listed on blanks which have been distributed in the schools. If parents do not get one of these census blanks, they are to call the elementary school office.

The school census will continue through January 31. "This is an aid in planning
