is probably one of the most talked about topics in Texas
tand the nation today and the nation today. The top-
ic is attacked from various ic is attacked from various
sides--law enforcement, mor-
ality, punishment ality, punishment., II is also

education.
It's this attack which has II's this attack which has
been launched by the Texas
Sate State Department of Hea lth's
Division of Public Health Education. The Department has about this growing menace to the total population because of
its direct implications to public
About two years ago the Department became aware that
serious deficiency existed in serious deficiency existed in
the area of public health educ ation concerning drug abuse. As the deficiency became in-
creasingly apparent, and becreasingly apparent, and be-
cause of the Department's existing activity in registering
wholesale drug outlets, the Division of Public Heaith Education began to accept reques
for its participation in drug abuse programs in schools, tea cher rraining programs,
civic organizations During this two year period, traveling to various pasts of the
state presenting an educational concept of drug abuse control.
To date, more than 500 To date, more than 500 such
classes have been held with an classes have been held with an
audience of some 50,000 stuaudience of some 5,000 stu-
dents.
The actual course consists The actual course consists of
showing one of several films-showinatily the film entitled
"Mariha na" a no preaching "Marihuana" a a "no preaching,
tell-it-like-it-is" film. The tell-it-like-it-is" film, The
film depicts a "pot party" being raided by the police. As

party to a waiting patrol cars, each expresses his or her thoughts about smoking mari-
huana and defends the use of
