Spear man sagged all three guards on Buna's 5-10 post Darlene Singleton but she still amassed 33 points. The lead changed hands or was tied on 13 occasons until the Lynxettes took command by driving into a 48 - 41 advantage with 5: 56 left in the contest.
Buna erased a six point Lynxettes lead in the fourth period and was given an added boost when Spearman guard Liz Hohertz drew her fourth foul late in the third period. However, Miss Patterson, who tallied 31 points from the charity stripe in two games, sank four straight free throws and Miss Smith canned a 12 footer to put the game away. Miss Smith actually broke the backs of Buna, when she hit 6 straight points from the floor. The fine Spearman Senior, who is also basketball queen hit better than 80 percent from the floor in the game. She only shot 7 times, and hit 6 of them, with hapless Buna, unable to stop her.
Miss Shieldknight shot 4 times from the floor and hit 3, for a fantastic shooting percentage also.
