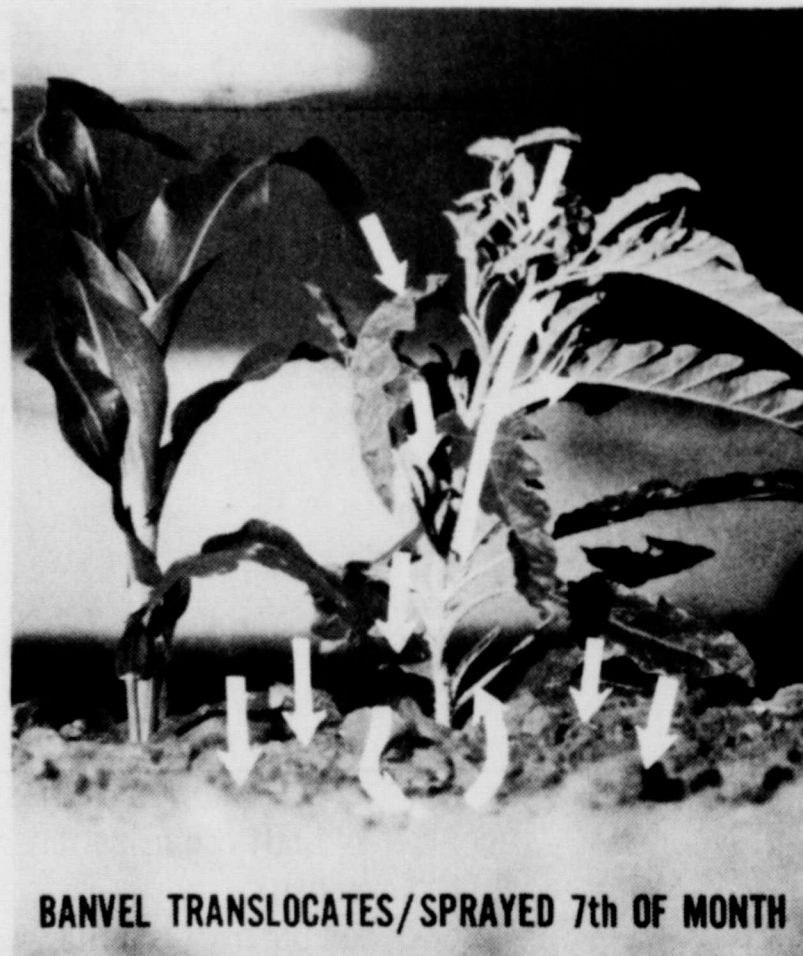
Birthday Party For April Abston

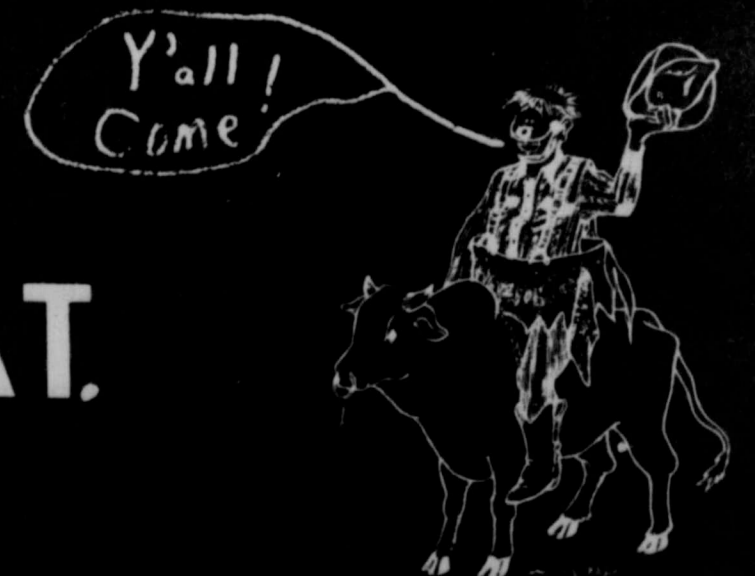
