The high school administration joins in welcoming the fans from Canadian to the home opener for the Spearman Lynx, to be played at Lynx stadium, Friday night.

Also, you are reminded of the Thursday games; 7th-8th grade plays Panhandle here at 5 p . m. Sept. 14 - Spearman B team plays at Panhandle Sept. $14-7$ p. m.

The School Board voted Monday night to call a referendum election to determine the community's wishes in a proposal to build track facilities at the high school.
Should this referendum pass the board will issue time warrants in the amount of $\$ 50,000$. This money will be used to build all weather track facilities south of the high school. The warrants would be repaid over a five year period beginning with the 1973-74 school year
This procedure was selected by the board in preference to a bond election. Issuance of time warrants will cost about $\$ 1,000$ less than issuance of bonds. Interest rates will be approximately the same. Several board members have indicated a willingness to purchase some of the warrants without collecting the interest as it falls due. It is thought that others in the community might wish to do the same.
Although the board can issue time warrants without an expression from the community, the board feels the public should have this opportunity to express its wishes in this manner.
Voting will be at the high school in the business office on September 20th, 2lst, and 22nd. Voting time will be 8: 00 A.M. to 5: 00 P.M. daily. All registered voters residing within the Spearman Independent School District will be eligible to vote.
