## LYNXETTES WIN 6th STRAIGHT CHAMPIONSHIP AT FRIONA

The Lynxettes attended the Friona tourney last weekend and won it for the sixth straight year. The Lynxettes have played in the tournament for six years and have yet to lose the championship in the six years consecutive. This year the Lynxettes have played nine games and have won 8 of them, 7 games being won in a row. In the tournament they defeated Dimmitt, Tulia and Friona. In the Dimmitt game the Lynxettes won by a score of 58-36 as Leann Shieldknight hit for 45 points, Peggy Floyd and Rhonda Jones each had 4 pts, Marilee Ooley had 3 and Kristie Gressett had 2 pts to round out the scoring for Spearman with 58 pts. The team hit 4 of 6 freethots.

In the Tulia game the Lynxettes again scored over the 50 pt. mark. This time the Lynxettes defeated the Tulia Hornettes 51-41 in the semi-finals of the tournament. Once again Leann Shieldknight dunked in 37 points as high point for the Lynxettes, with Peggy Floyd hitting on 12 points. Michelle Schumann scored 2 pts. The Lynxettes hit 6 of 9 from the freeshot line. The win enabled the Lynxettes to advance into the finals against the host team Friona.

The finals were played on Saturday night as the Lynxettes battled the Squaws from Friona. This was the Lynxettes closest game of the tournament. As the final horn blew, the Lynxettes had taken the victory by one point 36-35. The game was the best of the whole tournament as the Lynxettes played the toughest team for the Championship, and this also was the 4th time that the Lynxettes have played Friona in the finals of the tourney. The high honors in this game goes to Leann Shieldknight with 26 points, Peggy Floyd with 8, and Rhonda Jones with 2 points to give the Lynxettes the win and the sixth straight championship in the Friona tournament.

The Spearman Lynx didn't fare as well in the Friona Tourney as did the girls, but the boys played some fine basketball against some tough teams. The Lynx won their first game but lost the next two and were unable to overcome the height that the other teams had. The Lynx played Vega, Friona and Lubbock Estacado. They managed to bomb Vega in the first round of play by a 41-26 score as Jerry Pat Davis led the Lynx scoring with 10 points. Scott Beedy and Martin Hendrick each had 8 points, Doug Porter hit for 6, David McMullan had

3, and Ranch Schell, Brent Wheeler and William Porter each shared 2 points. The Lynx hit 11 of 15 free shots and only committed 8 fouls. The win enabled the Lynx to advance into the semi-finals against Friona.

The Lynx found game No. 2 a little rough going as they were unable to stop the Chiefs of Friona from scoring and Friona won the game over the Lynx 42-39. The Lynx scoring came from Scott Beedy with 12 points, Randy Schell with 9, Martin Hendrick with 6, Jerry Pat Davis hit 4, David McMullan also had 4; Doug Porter and Brent Wheeler each hit for 2 points. The Lynx then advanced into the Saturday play for third place against Lubbock Estacado. The Lynx hit 1 of 5 freethots in the Friona game on Friday.

The Saturday game was the last chance the Lynx had to win a trophy in this tournament and they had to meet another tough and very tall team. The Lynx were to battle Lubbock Estacado for the third place spot and it was all in vain as they were unable to handle the jumping jacks from Lubbock. The Lynx fell short by only 10 points, losing 56-46. Scott Beedy had a hot hand in this game as he hit for 20 big points and Randy Schell hit in double figures with 11 pts. Doug Porter followed with 4 as did Martin Hendrick, Brent Wheeler had 3 pts, and Jerry Pat Davis hit for two and David McMullan added two points also to round out the Lynx scoring for the night.

## Money Thief At Work

For the second time in a two-week period a theft of money from the Spearman high school has been reported to City Police. Some time over the weekend of November 18, some \$195.00 in currency and rolled coins was taken from a small room which adjoins the Superintendent's office at the high school.

Mrs. June Porter reported on November 30 the theft of \$190.00 in currency and rolled coins from the small lockbox in her speech department classroom. About three o'clock that day Mrs. Porter noticed that the combination lock had been sawed off and the money missing. The thief left some \$98.00 in checks and change in the box, taking only the currency and rolls of quarters. This was money the speech class students made on their pancake supper staged Tuesday night, Nov. 28. Police Chief Leland Woods is investigating these thefts.

## Gas, Telephone Utility companies Asking Hike

When the Spearman city council meets Monday, December 11, officials from High Plains Natural Gas Company and from General Telephone company will be on hand. Both these utility companies are asking for "rate adjustments."

The Gas Company submitted a rate increase proposal a short time ago which the Council turned down flat. Next Monday night company officials will show up with "an amendment clause" to the City's present contract in the form of a rate adjustment. City Manager Mike Struve said this amendment would be acted upon by the council Monday night.

Spearman buys fuel from High Plains Gas at the rate of 35 cents per 1000 cubic foot. The company says it is having to pay this amount from its suppliers and officials are asking for a rate adjustment "clause" in their contract and promise that when their costs fluctuate--up or down--they will pass this on to the City.

General Telephone officials are requesting rate increases on business phones and semi-public phones. They want to increase business telephone rates \$1.70 a month and convert all semi-public phones to regular business telephones. Semi-public facilities are pay phone located at a place of business.

Monday night's meeting is set for 8 p.m. Instead of the usual hour of 7:30. At 7:30 the Council will meet with School Board officials to discuss the proposed new swimming pool.

The City Council has approved a "Z" shaped pool with three possible locations: at the site of the present pool; at the south end of the football field, or in the Blodgett-Linn park on east 11th street. The City Council wishes

to get the school board's feelings about future plans for a competitive swim program in the school's curriculum, and also to ask what the school plans are concerning the present football field.

The football stadium is located on City property, which is leased to the school. If a new stadium might be in the school's future plans, the proposed swimming pool could be ideally built at the south end of the stadium. If not, this location might not be so good.

If the school has a strong interest (in the next few years) to include competitive swimming as a part of the PE program, the park location could be an ideal spot, just across from the high school building.

Monday night's meeting is merely another step in the City Council's program of planning the best location for the proposed new swimming pool. The pool's location must be determined before work on cost estimates can begin.

The Z-shaped pool plan, approved by the Council, features six 7-foot junior olympic size swimming lanes, which make up the middle length of the Z. On one end would be the diving well, and at the other end of the Z, water depth would vary from 18 inches to some 16 feet, or whatever the pool's depth is to be. A separate wading pool for children is also in the plan.

The Council meeting which begins at 8 p.m. Monday night is open to the public.

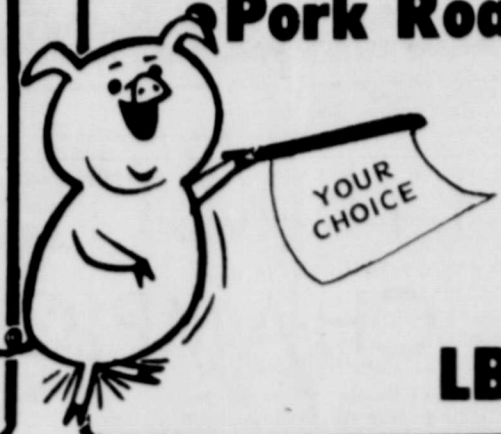

Some of you may have been wondering if we'd give you a recipe for candied citrus peel.

Select and wash thick-skinned grapefruit or oranges. Cut into quarters; remove pulp.

Sweetened condensed milk may be made using 2 cups non fat dry milk, 1 cup sugar and 1/2 cup water.

Household Formula for Keeping Christmas Trees Green-1/4 cup Green Garder micronized iron, 1 gallon hot water, 2 cups light Karo corn syrup, 4 teaspoons Chlorox or other chlorinated household bleach.

Mix micronized iron into hot water. Stir in corn syrup and bleach.

It makes a bluish, green mixture with particles which settle to the bottom.

1. Use either a strong household detergent or an ounce of household ammonia per gallon of water.

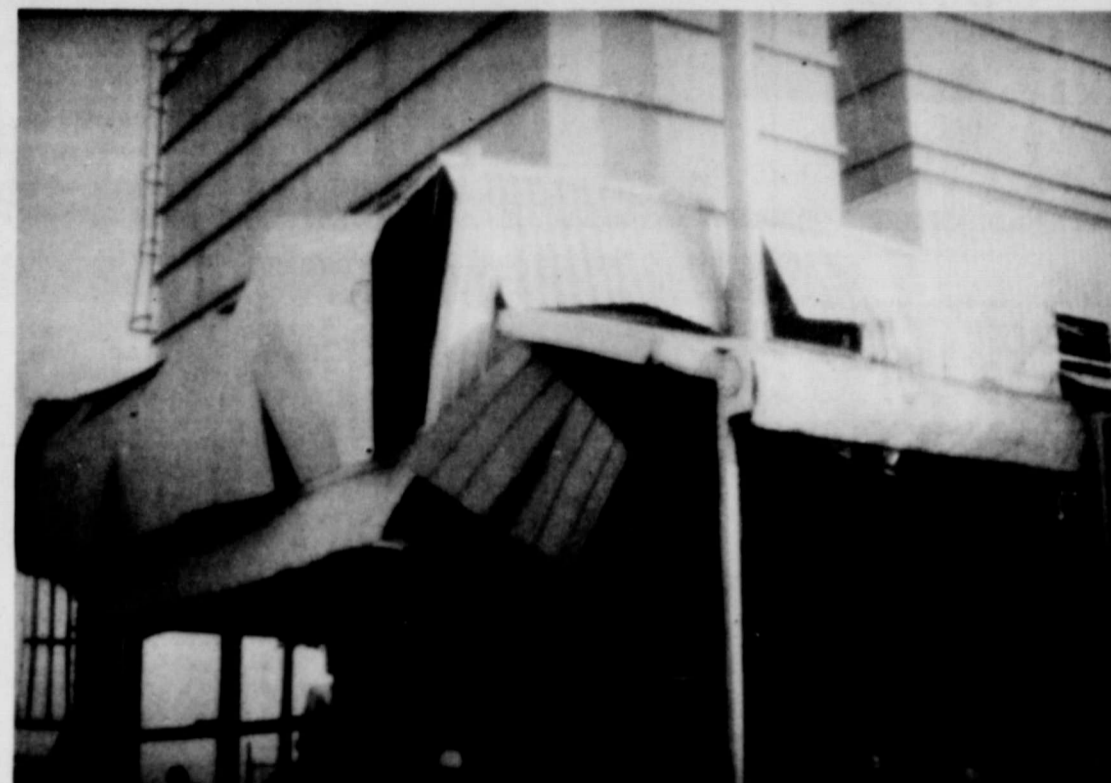
