Thrips Seen In Grain Sorghum

## In recent days, thrips have Infested many grain sorghum fieldis in the area. The thrips ane are very small, slender, agile bugs rarely as long as oneeighth inch. They are rasping, suclang insects that feed on suckang insects that eeed on plant sap and cause irreular yellowing areas and possibly yellowing areas and possibly drying and shriveling of the drying and shriveling of the leaves. It is hard to different- ate between shrive ling caused ate between shrive ing caused by wind and that caused by the thrip. Thrips do not secrete any thrip. Thrips do not secrete any poisons into the leaves where they feed

 In previous years thrips have age to grain sorghum. Howeve after inspecting some fields re-cently, I encourage farmers to inspect each grain sorghum
field you have. Each field needs to be evaluated on its
individual merits for thrip
id damage.
Once grain sorghum is up 5 good, I be lieve that the thrips will not be causing any econo-
mic damage to sorghum. Howmic damage to sorghum. How-
ever, while the sorghum is real
small and tender some fields smail and tender some fields
appear to have heavy thrip pop-
ulations that need some chem cal control measuruseme applied
But here again this is But here again this is not a
blanket recommentation that
all fields need spraying. Each field needs to be evaluated ev
ery 2 or 3 days by the farmer.
There are no real guidelines To use in knowing when to
spray-each farmer will need spray-each farmer will need
to evaluate each field on its own stage of growth and leve
