### **BRETT HOYLE, Pastor, First Baptist Church**

Tucked away in the back of the book of James is an often misunderstood, misquoted, and misused set of verses that is mishandled as formula for healing, rather than a call to prayer.

James 5:13-18 is a powerful passage that resounds the call to pray, pray and keep on praying. In fact, the word "pray" or "prayer" is used in ever verse in this section. He begins by commanding you to pray and praise depending on life's circumstances.

From there, v14-15 tells those who are sick and weak to call for the church leadership to come and pray over them, anoint them with oil and trust God for the results. The promise God gives is that the sick will be made well, and the prayer of faith will heal the sick. This passage raises a huge question.

Is this verse a promise of healing on demand, as long as you follow these steps, and pray in faith?

No, it is not for at least two reasons. One, if this was the case you could never die, and secondly the Bible shows that sometimes God's plan allows for suffering (Job, Paul in 2 Cor 12, Jesus on the Cross).

If this verse isn't a formula for on demand healing, then school personnel are invited to come and be blessed. what is it about?

First, this passage is a call to pray, pray, pray and pray some more with your church family when life hits. Go to the local church when you have troubles, not the faith-healer on TV or the religious con-artist selling sacred scarfs that will make you well.

Next this passage is an invitation to call upon the Lord for physical healing, and even more to commit ones' self to the Lord's plan, even if that includes suffering and He brings ultimate healing through death. I have seen the Lord heal miraculously with people in our church, but the prayer of faith is faith in the Lord's will, not my own.

Finally, realize that the prayer of faith echoes the prayer of Jesus from the garden that pleads, "My Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from me; nevertheless, not as I will, but as you will," (Matthew 26:39b).

**Explanatory Statements for the** November 3, 2015 Constitutional Amendment Election

**Proposition Number 1** 

(SJR 1) SJR 1 - Current law provides an exemption of \$15,000 from the ad valorem taxation for public school purposes of a residence homestead. The proposed amendment would increase this exemption to \$25,000, starting in the tax year beginning January 1, 2015. In order to reflect the increased exemption on the homestead of a person 65 years of age or older or a disabled person, the proposed amendment would provide a reduction to the current limitation on the total amount of ad valorem taxes. The proposed amendment would protect school districts from all or part of the revenue loss by authorizing an appropriation of funds according to formulas set by the legislature. In addition, the proposed amendment would authorize the legislature to prohibit a political subdivision from reducing or repealing a homestead exemption adopted by the political subdivision. Finally, the proposed amendment would prohibit the imposition of a tax on the conveyance of real property, but would not prohibit the imposition of a business tax measured by business activity, a tax on the production of minerals, a tax on the issuance of title insurance, or a change in the rate of a tax in existence on January

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment increasing the amount of the \$15,000 to \$25,000, providing for taxes that may be imposed for those purposes on the homestead of an elderly or disabled person to reflect the increased exemption authorizing the amount, legislature to prohibit a political subdivision that has adopted an optional residence homestead exemption from ad valorem taxation from reducing the amount of or repealing the

exemption, and prohibiting the enactment of a law that imposes a transfer tax on a transaction that conveys fee simple title to real property."

**Proposition Number 2** 

(HJR 75) HJR 75 - In 2011, voters approved a constitutional amendment to allow a surviving spouse of a 100 percent or totally disabled veteran an exemption from ad valorem taxation from all or part of the market value on the disabled veteran's residence homestead, as long as the surviving spouse had not remarried. The amendment did not apply to surviving spouses of veterans who died before 2011. This amendment would extend the exemption in such cases. The proposed amendment would apply only to ad valorem taxes imposed for a tax year beginning on or after January 1, 2016.

The proposed amendment would appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment authorizing the legislature to provide for an exemption from ad valorem taxation of all or part of the market value of the residence homestead of the surviving spouse of a 100 percent or totally disabled veteran who died before the law authorizing a residence homestead exemption for such a veteran took effect."

> **Proposition Number 3** · (SJR 52)

SJR 52 proposes a constitutional amendment to repeal the requirement for the Comptroller of Public Accounts, the Commissioner of the General Land Office, the residence homestead exemption Attorney General, and any other from ad valorem taxation for officers elected statewide to reside public school purposes from in Austin, Texas, the state capital. Under current law, these statewide a reduction of the limitation on elected officers are required to reside the total amount of ad valorem in the capital of the State of Texas while in office. This amendment would not apply to the residency requirement for the Governor.

> The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment repealing the requirement that state officers elected by voters statewide reside in the state

**Proposition Number 4** (HJR 73)

HJR 73 proposes a constitutional amendment that would grant the legislature the authority to pass statutes to allow a professional sports team charitable foundation to conduct charitable raffles under the terms and conditions imposed by general law. The laws passed under this authority may provide that the professional sports team charitable foundation may use proceeds from such charitable raffles to pay reasonable advertising, promotional, and administrative expenses. Any law enacted by this provision only applies to entities defined as professional sports team charitable foundations on January 1, 2016. Additionally, any law enacted by this provision may only allow charitable raffles to be conducted at games hosted at the home venue of the professional sports team associated with a professional sports team charitable foundation.

The proposed amendment would appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment authorizing the legislature to permit professional sports team charitable foundations to conduct charitable raffles."

> **Proposition Number 5** (SJR 17)

SJR 17 proposes a constitutional amendment which would increase from 5,000 to 7,500 the maximum total population threshold of a county that is allowed to construct and maintain private roads as long as the county imposes a reasonable charge for the work.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment to authorize counties with a population of 7,500 or less to perform private road construction and maintenance."

> Proposition Number 6 (SJR 22)

SJR 22 proposes a constitutional amendment that would add the right to hunt, fish and harvest wildlife, including by use of traditional methods, in the Bill of Rights of the Texas Constitution. This right would be subject to laws and regulations intended to conserve

and manage wildlife and to preserve the future of hunting and fishing. The proposed amendment would establish hunting and fishing as the preferred method of managing and controlling wildlife in Texas. > **Proposition Number 7** (SJR 5)

SJR 5 proposes a constitutional amendment to dedicate a portion of revenues from (1) the state sales and use tax, and (2) the tax imposed on the sale, use, or rental of a motor vehicle, to the State Highway Fund (SHF). Under current law, these funds would be deposited to the General Revenue Fund. Money deposited to the SHF is intended to be used only to construct, maintain, or acquire rights-of-way for public roadways other than toll roads; or to repay certain transportation-related

The proposed amendment would appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment dedicating certain sales and use tax revenue and motor vehicle to the state highway fund to provide funding for nontolled roads and the reduction of certain transportation-related debt."

A tax rate of \$0.541600 per \$100 valuation has been proposed by the governing body of Parmer County. This rate exceeds the lower of the effective or rollback tax rate, and state law requires that two public hearings be held by the governing body before adopting the proposed tax rate.

The rollback tax rate is the highest tax rate that Parmer County may adopt before voters are entitled to petition for an election to limit the rate that may be approved to the rollback rate.
