As I have mentioned a time or two, we have a Chihuahua. His name is Buster. I guess when he picked us that February four years ago the week before we had the 10 below weather, he thought this would be a really warm alternative to life on the streets.

Not long after his arrival, but long enough to get attached ,he met me at the back gate when Monica and Elaina had gone over to the church building. I opened the gate and he bolted. He was in a panic the girls had left so like a shot he took off looking for them but running at speeds that rivaled a cheetah. I took chase being in fine shape myself I was sucking air by the time I crossed Prospect (half a block). I caught him at the dumpster behind First Baptist as he had stopped to read the latest news left by other dogs in the area. I scooped him up and scolded him for two blocks, as if he understood every word I was saying, I was even using a "preacher voice." We got home, I put him in his sleeping crate, shut the door and said firmly, "bad dog" and popped the top of the crate for effect.

He suddenly associated his home as punishment and for the most part has feared the crate the last four years although I have not done anything but gently put him in it each night since.

The other night I got ready for bed and couldn't find Buster anywhere only to find him quietly nestled into his crate with the door wide open.

I fear there are times that some folks get a little panicked and bolt from the body of Christ and when we catch up to them all we have to offer is a sermon, a scolding and we place in their hearts a fear of what should be the safe place. His church.

Sometimes it takes a little time, but if we will just leave the door open and meet them with grace and care they may once again find that refuge and realize even Christians mess it up too.

If you have ever felt the way our little dog did, I am sorry, I have met many over the years who struggle, because in their moment of crisis they were met with a list of failures; a sermon bent on forcing repentance right then.

It seems when we read the pages of the New Testament that Jesus handled it differently. He left the door open and gave the hurting room and saved the sermon and whippin for the self-righteous religious folks of His day. Jesus, according to the gospel of John chapter 1 was full of grace and truth and God knew we needed both. Truth to help us understand the destructive nature of sin and life without God and Grace to know we could still find forgiveness and an open door.




