We Can't Relax Defense Pace

Secretary of Defense Marshall took time the other day to comment sadly on the growing complacency toward the U.S. defense effort notable both in Congress and the nation at large.

He pointed out that two months ago lawmakers were demanding to know why he wasn't doing more in mobilizing military strength. Now they're wondering why the armed forces need so many men.

This change of mood can be seen in many places. President Truman is basking in the Florida sun and Secretary of State Acheson thinks it's safe to enjoy Bermuda for a while.

Congress appears pre-occupied with the RFC scandal, the crime investigation, the Tydings-Butler election squabble, and similar matters. There's talk that new taxes, rated a prime anti-inflation weapon, may not get attention soon enough to take effect before next January 1.

The Pentagon is proceeding leisurely in working out the details of its expanding armaments program. It's not ready to tell Congress what it needs and how much it will cost. The legislators aren't pressing for the information.

What accounts for this relaxed mood? Many things, apparently. Our recent limited but definite gains on the Korean front, leading us to believe we may not get pushed off the peninsula after all. A lot of second and third guessing about Russia's ability and willingness to fight a big war at this time.

Not to be overlooked is the Administration's consistent failure to sustain a sense of urgency. Many seasoned observers are agreed that neither the President nor any of his chief wollded and administration. Father Cox, Leader Of Jobless March On Washington Dies

PITTSBURGH -(P)- The Rev. James R. Cox, one of the most striking figures of the depression years and one-time nominee for the presidency on a short-lived ticket, died Monday night.

The 65-year-old Catholic priest. nationally famous as a leader of a eekers' march to Washington in 1932, was stricken by a cerebral hemorrhage. He had been in failing health for several years.

He collapsed in the rectory of old St. Patrick's Church, where he had been pastor 28 years, and died a few hours later without regaining con-sciousness. At his bedside were the Rev. James L. Burke, his senior assistant, and others of the olergy who long had been associated with him in religious and social work.

Born March 7, 1886, in Pittsburgh, Father Cox sold newspapers on city streets to help pay for his education. Having known the rigors of an outspoken champion of the underdog, a helper of struggling, conyouth. As a young priest, he drew both boys and girls off the streets, and taught them sports, dramatics and music. One of his boxing pupils was the late Harry Greb world middleweight champion,

Army Of Unemployed
Nation-wide attention first was focussed upon him in January, 1932, when he set out from old St. Patricks at the head of an "Army of the Unemployed." More than 20,000 men made up this army, and they traveled to Washington-in jalopies and trucks and on foot-to petition President Hoever for relief.

"It is jobs these men want-not charity," Father Cox declared. All along the way crowds gathered to watch the strange caravan and

especially to glimpse its leader Later, Father Cox organized the "Blue Shirts" to further his program aimed at social and economic betterment of the masses, particularly the unemployed. At its peak, the organization claimed 200,000

In August, 1932, Father Cox joined forces with "Coin" Harvey of Arkansas and a national convention assembled in St. Louis as the "Lib Jobless" Party. But the two men split there, each then heading his ewn ticket

inated For President

Father Cox was nominated for the presidency at a meeting of some in Pitt Stadium. He camnaigned briefly, then withdrew, urging his supporters to vote for Frenklin D. Rossevelt. After Roossveit's election, the "Blue Shirts" were dispanded. Eventually Father Cox was named a member of the National Recovery Beard in Pennsylvania.

Meanwhile, Father Cox intensified his efforts to relieve the distress of those out of work. He set up soup kitchens in this heavily industria area, kept them going throughout the depression, and reckoned that in all more than 2,000,000 free meals were served.

Newspapers called him a frank and "picturesque man of the cloth." To many people he was "the paster of the poor."

By OSWALD JACOBY Written for NEA Service Many players in various parts of the country like to play "local" rules in canasta They will find some of their ideas in the new, exciting game of samba (three-pack canasta.)

The law most players like to tinker with has to do with taking the discard pile. My friend and favorite partner, John R. Crawford, describes how that law works in samba.

Taking the Pack in samba: In samba you may never take the discard pile with one matching card and a wild card. You always need a pair matching natural cards ex-

(a) the deck is not frozen; and (b) the top card of the discard pile matches one of the minor melds (less than canasta) that your side has melded at a previous turn; of the top card of the discard pile fits immediately to either end of a sequence (three to six cards) that your side has melded at a previous

example, suppose the card of the discard pile is the eight of spades and that it is your turn to play. You can take the pile: (a) at any time if you have a

pair of eights in your hand. (b) to add to any meld of eights (three to six cards) already down on the table.

(c) to add directly to either end of a sequence that was down on the table before your turn began-provided that the sequence is three to six cards in length (not completed samba) and also that the deck is not frozen. Thus, you would add the eight to Spades A-K-Q-J-10-9 or Spades Q-J-10-9 or to Spades 7-6-5, etc.

However, you could not take that eight with:

(a) one matching eight and a wild

(b) a completed canasta of eights (unless you also had a brand new pair of eights in your hand). (c) a completed sequence ca

nasta. (d) a sequence meld that was not down on the table before your

(e) a previously melded sequence that skips before the eight fits on. Thus, you could not take the eight with Spade Q-J-10- on the table even if you also had the Spade 9 in your hand.

Let me repeat, to avoid confusion, that these rules do not apply to regular canasta. In or inary canasta you're allowed to take the pack with a matching card and a wild card (after your side ha melded. Moreover, you're allowed to take the pile if the top card matches your closed canasta.



Will Probe Fatal Presidio Shooting MARFA —(A)— Presidio County

July Grand Jury

Attorney Norman C. Davis said the case of J. C. Poole, Presidio justice of the peace involved in a fatal shooting, would be presented to the grand jury in July.

Poole has been free on bond on a charge of assault to murder Jack Edward Jennings, 19, of Presidio. Jennings died Sunday in El Paso, where he had been taken for treat-

Poole waived a preliminary hearing following Jennings' death. The shooting came when Deputy Sheriff Mack Tarwater attempted to arrest Jennings because there were no license plates on Jennings' truck.

Witnesses said a scuffle followed The deputy was shot in the hand. Poole is accused of having then Shot Jennings.

tion, for example, also show other nervous signs such as tendency to easy blushing, a spastic colon, or just being "high strung." If, as is usually the case, no physical explanation can be found to account for the difficulty, what can

be done? Anything which acts favorably on the sympathetic nervous system including appropriate exercise, exposure to sunlight, or frequent bathing might be expected to
