



Korean Problem Remains

Basic to the entire dilemma confronting the United States and the UN in the Far East is how to conclude the war in Korea. As that conflict now is being conducted, no one can see any end to it. Soldiers in the field and people at home wonder where we are heading and how long the fighting will last.

The puzzle is not solved by the ouster of General MacArthur-it is only highlighted. In fact, his successor, General Ridgway, declared just a short time ago-"I see no end to the military operations unless there is a political settlement." All this concern is perfectly natural.

We know we and other UN countries are in Korea to resist Red aggression. We are doing that successfully. But we don't know how much of Korea we are supposed to sweep clear of the aggressor.

From the fact our troops are shoving the Communists northward above the 38th parallel, it's evident our top diplomats and military men don't consider that line a final stopping point. But it's just as plain that with General Ridgway's present force he can't hope to thrust the Chinese and North Korean Reds out of all Korea.

A fresh look at the map shows why. 

A cue-bid (one that shows control rather than a real suit) often helps the partnership reach the best contract. However, it is important not to make such a bid if it helps the enemy more than your side.

In today's hand, for example, East was technically correct in bidding four spades. Why Agencies Need Such Fancy Fixtures

WASHINGTON—(P)—A congressional committee which keeps an eye on federal spending wonders if the new defense agencies need so many davenports and easy chairs on which to mull over price control

In a report Monday night, the littee headed by Senator Byrd (D-Va) asserted five of the emergency agencies "in their infancy have spent more than \$1,000,000 for furniture and supplies, \$250,000 of it for plush furnishings.

The defense agencies, the committee said, "have already manilested a tendency to over-indulge in the expensive type furniture." Included in the furniture, the re-

ort said, were these items: 145 executive desks for \$41,000: 1,324 secretaries' desks for \$140,-

1,187 costumers (clothes trees) for

\$14,200, and 143 davenports and easy chairs for \$26,500.

Economic Stabilization Agency, which handles price controls, alone bought 118 executive desks at \$279 apiece, 95 easy chairs at \$155 apiece, and 26 davenports at \$268 apiece, the report said.
