The information provided on the application will be used for the purpose of determining eligibility and may be verified at any time during the school year by school or other program officials. The application must be signed by an adult household member.

Under the provisions of the free and reduced price meal policy, only the Verifying Official will review applications and determine eligibility. Parents or guardians dissatisfied with the ruling of the official may wish to discuss the decision with the reviewing official on an informal basis.

Applications may be submitted at any time during the year, and our school district strongly encourages everyone to fill one out and sent it in. If a family qualifies for only reduced prices, it will significantly reduce the cost of meals. In the operation of the child feeding program, no child will be discriminated against because of race, sex, color, national origin, age or handicap. If you believe you have been discriminated against, write immediately to the Secretary of Agriculture, Washington, D.C., 20250
