

Kearns was working on the big build-up now and knockouts, but young Dempsey made a grand impression going 10 rounds with clever Billy Miske in St. Paul in May of 1918. He was hardly sharp when he required 12 rounds to flatten Bill Brennan in New York in December of 1920, although the Irishman was considerably more formidable than a lot of people believe.

If there was any question about Dempsey's boxing ability, it was

dissipated when he and Tommy Gibbons stepped 15 rounds like feather-weights in Shelby in 1923. Dempsey was 31 when he boxed Gene Tunney the first time, and his legs were beginning to go, yet the Manly Marine will tell you he did not once hit him squarely in 20 stanzas.
