

Fuhrman Schedules Deep Prospector In W-C Andrews Area

Fuhrman Petroleum Corporation of Midland is to start drilling soon at a 13,000-foot Ellenburger wildcat in West-Central Andrews County.

The prospector will be Fuhrman No. 1-E W. T. Ford. It is to be seven miles southwest of the town of Andrews and 760 feet from south and 330 feet from west lines of the quarter of section 16, block A-43, psi survey.

The project is on the east side of the shallow Fuhrman-Mascho field. That reservoir produces from the upper Permian limes above 5,000 feet.

Austral Oil Exploration Company Inc., reported oil flow on two drillstem tests in the Ellenburger in No. 1 V. E. Probandt, wildcat in the County.

One of the tests was taken in the interval from 8,585 to 8,610 feet. Gas surfaced in eight minutes, mud in 24 and oil in 35 minutes.
