Strictly in the Texas tradition, a multi-million-dollar drouth joined with a multi-million-dollar heat wave Tuesday to continue a pace of death and ruin.

Tuesday was the eighteenth day of temperatures of more than 100 degrees over the Dallas-Fort Worth-Wichita Falls triangle.

The brutal heat slowed work on construction projects across Texas as workmen, like crops in the field, wilted in the blazing sun, unhampered save by high, wispy clouds.

Rangelands and pastures contin-ued to dry up and cattle munched tisofritedly on tinder dry grass. Livestock was losing weight in the un-baked pastures and was moving to market in unseasonally heavy umbers. Stockmen lost money as the livestock lost weight and met a depressed market when they at-





Stevenson On Hiss

Every once in a while there arises a situation which can best be answered only by referring back to the record. trite as that expression often seems to be

Such a situation is the relationship that existed between Gov. Adlai Stevenson, the Democratic presidential nominee, and Alger Hiss. It arises because of the probability that the matter will be revived in the campaigning between now and the November elections.

As pointed out by Peter Edson, Reporter-Telegram columnist, last April, the issue hinges on testimony Stevenson gave in the form of a deposition at Hiss' trial for perjury in New York, June 22, 1949.

The deposition, made at the request of Hiss' lawyers, was read to the court:

Q-How long have you known Mr. Alger Hiss, the defendant?

A-Since June or July, 1933. We served together in the legal division of the Agricultural Adjustment Administration in Washington in 1933. . . . Our contact was frequent but not close or daily. I had no further contact with him until I met him again in the State Department when I went to work there in 1945. . . . I met him mostly in intradepartmental meetings. . . .






