Sohio Moves District Office To Midland; Expands Scope, Area

Effective Monday Schio Petroleum Company will move its West Texas-New Mexico district headquarters from Abilene to Midland.

Sohio established operational headquarters from Abilene in April, 1948. The greater part of the concern at that time were concentrated in West-Central Texas.

During the past several years Sohio's activities have expanded into West Texas and New Mexico. The greatest concentration of Sohio's acreage holdings and operations are presently in the West Texas area.

Three Departments

The district land and geological departments in Midland will be under the supervision of Frank John-, district landman, and Walter Wilkinson, district geologist.

The production department willbe under the supervision of A. K. Hood, district superintendent, who has been in Midland since August,

The aereal extent of the district will cover 121 counties in West Texas and West-Central Texas, as well as 13 counties in Southeast New Mexico. However, the greatest concentration of activity will be placed on the West Texas portion of the

For the present Sohio's headquarters at Midland will be at its recently constructed operations office on the Rankin Highway.

Heat, Drouth **Damage Over** State Mounts

Texas farmers and ranchers-already eligible for emergency federal loans-hoped to persuade the governor Wednesday they need still another form of drouthdisaster aid from the government.

Farm leaders gathered in Austin for a meeting called Governor Shiyers to consider asking the President to

declare Texas a drouth-disaster area under the terms of Public Law 875. This would authorize the Agriculture Department's Commodity Credit Corporation to bring livestock feed into sun-burned Texas from areas that have plenty of it.

Since last year the entire state has been designated a disaster area under Public Law 32. Under this law, the Farmers Home Administration makes emergency loans to drouthridden farmers and ranchers. dollars worth of these loans this

Another Blow At Lotteries-

Many persons who oppose gambling refuse to consider lottery in the same light although the federal government and many states long ago ruled that lottery is a form of gambling and unlawful.

Schemes frequently are proposed which merely are lotteries and many of these have been curbed by U. S. Postal Laws which forbid use of the mails in any way in connection with lotteries.

Now, the Bureau of Internal Revenue has held that stores or persons participating in "lottery plan merchandising must buy federal gambling tax stamps and pay a monthly wagering levy."

This is a government response to the crime investigation and it applies to all gambling operations and not just to the big time gamblers. True, a lottery may be a simple thing in which patricipants lose nothing or only a nominal sum. It may go by the simple name of a club, but the scheme or operation still is gambling.

Courts have ruled that "any exchange of property by chance is a lottery."
