This wildcat has shown for prolific flowing production from the Mississippian. It produced more than 360 barrels of oil in three hours

No other sections of the Mississippian were drillstem tested.

Since finding the flowing oil and no water in the bottom of the Devonian section which has been penetrated, operators may decide to drill deeper and determine how much Devonian pay the wildcat has above the water level in that formation.

Chinese Launch Biggest Vote In All State's **History Seen**

AUSTIN -(A)-Gov. Allan Shivers Thursday predicted flatly Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower will carry Texas. In a press conference, the governor also scored government loans to millionaires and said he was "not surprised" at another five per cent deal in the Truman Ad-

"I think General Eisenhower is picking up consid-

terably. I think the trend toward him is larger than I expected," he said, adding:

"I think Eisenhower will carry the state and that it will be the biggest vote the state has ever seen."

On the matter of government loans, Shivers said the Export-Import Bank, a government agency, had on October 17 granted a \$3,-664,000 loan to the Pan American Sulphur Company, headed by Houston millionaire J. R. Parten.

He said the National Democratic Campaign Committee had announced several days ago Parten and his associates have contributed several thousands of dollars to the Democratic campaign Strange Time For Lean

"It is strange in view of the campaign contributions of Parten and his associates that a \$3,500,000 loan should be granted just before the election," Shivers said.

controlling bootlegging: Officers say one glaring short-coming in the State Liquor Control Act is that known bootleggers can purchase all the whisky they want simply by saying it is for their own consumption. Liquor dealers catering to bootleggers have built stores in isolated spots where their illicit trade can continue relatively un-

noticed.

Can Be Delivered One swanky West Texas layoutan alcoholic casis on the edge of a local option desert—reportedly sells more than \$200,000 worth of liquor

Officers say dealers not only can sell to known bootleggers without violating the law, they also can draw up perfectly legal "false" road manifestos and haul beer right up the bootlegger's front door. Should they get caught unloading the beer, they can be prosecuted.

In order to make manifests legal. beer wholesaler in Odessa, for example, rents warehouse space and takes out a branch distributor's lirple of hundred cases of beer and akes out a bill of lading for the Amarillo warehouse! This gives him the legal right to haul the beer through the dry counties between Odessa and Amarillo.

Can Be Sidetracked Should he be stopped by any officer along the way, he simply shows his manifest and tells the officer to go catch someone who is violating the law.

The driver then goes to the bootegger, say in Lubbock, who ordered the beer and hurriedly unloads it. A couple of years ago a pair of alert officers in Lubbock spotted a semi-truck burdened down with beer parked in front of a club.

Without waiting for any unload-ing to begin, the officers arrested truck driver and confiscated his beer and truck. He quickly produced a bill of lading showing the brew enroute to Amarillo and maintained he had just stopped at the club to call his wife.
