## Humility Begins With Modesty

By John Ingram Walker, M.D.
When Benjamin Franklin "conceived the bold and arduous project of arriving at moral
perfection," he initially made a list of twelve virtues that he would attempt to master. Soon after Franklin added a thirteenth-humility. He wrote, "My list of irtues contained at first bu kindly informed me that I was generally thought proud; that my pride showed itself frequently in conversation; that I was not content with being in the right
when discussing my point, but was overbearing and rather insolent; of which he convinced me by mentioning several instances;-determined endeavoring to cure folly among the rest, and I added humility to my list...
Franklin decided that he would never directly contradict the ideas of others nor would he ever make a positive assertion of his own. He
eliminated every word that imported a rigid opinion such as "certainly" and "undoubtedly", and adopted instead of them," onceive," "I apprehend,'
In his "Autobiography,
Franklin said, "Perhaps for these
fifty years past no one has ever heard a dogmatical expression escape me." Wouldn't it be nice if o be that flexible? Franklin went on to make another interesting statement, "For I was but a bad speaker, never eloquent, subject to much hesitation in my choice of and yet I generally carried my
points."
Franklin reported that his indirect approach allowed others o more readily accept his opinions and he attributed his modesty to usually got his suggestions and proposals adopted by others. He said, 'I cannot boast of much success in acquiring the reality of (humility); but I had a good deal with regard to the appearance of
He closed this passage of his
"Autobiography" with these words, "In reality there is perhaps no one of our natural passions so ard to subdue as pride. Disguis
stifle it, mortify it as much as one
pleases, it is still alive and will every now and then peep out and show itself. You will see it perhaps often in this history. For even if I
could conceive that I had completely overcome it, I should
probably be proud of my humility."

Perhaps the modest acceptance of one's frailties marks humility's essence, and, in turn, allows us to better
accept the imperfections of others.

lake contains a panfish that seems lake contaiss a panlish that seems
to get every angler's attention sooner or later. This panfish is the crappie.
The crappie is easy to fillet and once located can be caught by almost anyone. It has been said

strikers. A tight line will help in detecting this type of strike. Many anglers prefer to use a float, but with the loose line, concentration is essential. The bobber may barely
move or appear to not move at all until the fish is excited and moves to free itself. When casting jigs a slow retrieve will produce more hook-ups than a faster retrieve. ## Evaluation Offered For Area Irrigators

Irrigation represents the nation' Industry and irrigation together use most of the water withdrawn from primary sources. In fact, farmers and ranchers withdraw
nearly five times as much water for irrigation as municipalities use, and three-fourths as much as industries do. Irrigation consumes
probably three times as much probably three times as much
water as all other uses combined. water as all other uses combined.
Throughout the irrigated areas farmers are becoming more conscious of the need to improve their irrigation systems and distribution lay-outs in order to use the
already available water more already available water more
efficiently. Water conservation must be accomplished through human effort. It will not get done until people have the knowledge, desire and means to do it. In al
cases, a conservation farm plan is cases, a conservation farm plan is
very important as a farmer's own guide in making the right decisions as to the kinds and sequence of practice to be applied on irrigated
lands as on other land. lands as on other land. Water management on the farm
is the crux or pay-off of irrigation development, One of the practices being applied in the area is surge flow irrigation. Through surge flow irrigation in appropriate soils,
application ef ficiency can be as high as $85 \%$. Surge is a relatively recently development which allows for the intermittent application flow water to furrows in a series of surges rather than the traditional continuous furrow system. It helps reduction in deep percolation losses.
The use of sprinkler systems has expanded rapidly during the past have become increasingly popular in the area due to their reduced labor requirements and the ability
to irrigate $20-25 \%$ more acreage Six accidents to irrigate $20-25 \%$ more acreage with three injuries.

The Gonzales Courthouse in Gonzales County was completed in 1896 for a mere $\$ 64,450$. It is the second such building for the 150 year old county, the first having
burned in 1893 . The town was once called the "Lexington of Texas" because the first skirmish of the Texas Revolution was fought here. Gonzales was named for
