A 15-page statement prepared by AFL President George Meany for House Labor Committee hearings closely paralleled recommendations made public recently by the CIO. The effect of the proposals would be to return the basic labor law Kroenlein Essay

Seek Advice If Simple Means Don't Check Chronic Fatique

The proper balance between work, recreation and sleep has to be worked out, of course. Change of occupation is not often recommended in these cases, because it usually does not succeed. Many people need to learn how to relax when they have the chance.
