



QUESTION-I purchased carpeting for my living room and now my front door drags the carpeting. How may this be Childress. Redriquez (4) and Cas remedied?

ANSWER
There are several solutions to this problem. First: a new threshold 1½ inch thick may be purchased to replace the old threshold or the old threshold may be removed and a shim board placed on the floor and the old threshold replaced over it. After raising the threshold it will be necessary to trith the bottom of the door to fit. Then replace the weatherstripping. He sure, when you replace the threshold, that in the event of rain the water will not be allowed to run back under the new work. QUESTION-

I wish to repaint my living room. I do not know what type of paint has been used but I do not want the same kind used again. I want a washable paint. What is your rec-Vertagreen

ANSWER-A competent painter or paint dealer should be consulted about the condition of the old paint and about the preparation heeded to assure a lasting job. I like a type of small sinking plug which has barber-pole stripes on its body - that is, black stripes on a white background. I am probably partial to these because I have taken hundreds of bass in spot fishing with them. No doubt there are other colors that would do as well.
