## Two Arrested For

 School Break-InTwo suspects were arrested by the Friona Police Department on Thursday, and have been charged with the burglary at Friona High School.
Friona Chief of Police Lloyd Niece said that the arrests may hopefully clear up other local burglaries, although investigation was continuing on the residential break-ins. Some of the property that was taken from the school in the January 21 break-in has been recovered.
Niece said that evidence found at the scene, along with evidence given by local residents have aided the police department in making the arrests.
Arrested Thursday and charged with several counts of burglary were Ernie Crutchfield, 21, and Jessie Garcia, 22. Crutchfield was arraigned in Farwell on Thursday, and Garcia was arraigned before J.P. Frances Euler Friday morning. Bond for each was set at ${ }^{3} 5,000$.
The two arrested are believed to have been connected with the school robbery, one at Plains. Hardware and vandalism at E-Z Way Laundry
Warrants were expected to be issued for the arrest of wo other individuals implicated in the break-ins, according to Capt. Bailey Roberts of the Friona Police Department.

collected by clipping a coupon and mailing it to the paying agent. In few days, you received you interest payment.
Unless you own or can buy, on the secondary market, some of those days are gone. Several years ago, Congress decreed all new taxexempt bonds be issued in registered form and that the paying agent, usually a bank, mail the
interest checks directly to the bondholder.
On the surface, this may appear to be simply another Congressional invasion of the way we do
business. In practice, however, it has made investing in tax-exempt bonds much easier for thousands of investors.
Under the old bearer-bond
system, the certificate you received system, the certificate you received
had no name on it. It was in "bearer", form, which meant anyone who held it owned it. It was no simple matter to replace a lost, stolen or destroyed
bearer certificate. First, bearer certificate. First, there was
a waiting period, often up to one year, to make certain the bond had not been sold or redeemed. After this, your request for a
replacement certificate replacement certificate began. This
required the deposit of a substantial required the deposit of a substantial
cash bond, which was determined by the face value of the lost
certificate plus any remaining certificate plus any remaining
interest coupons. In the meantime, as your interest became due, you no coupons to submit for payment.
