

Two Arrested For School Break-In

Two suspects were arrested by the Friona Police Department on Thursday, and have been charged with the burglary at Friona High School.

Friona Chief of Police Lloyd Niece said that the arrests may hopefully clear up other local burglaries, although investigation was continuing on the residential break-ins.

Some of the property that was taken from the school in the January 21 break-in has been recovered.

Niece said that evidence found at the scene, along with evidence given by local residents have aided the police department in making the arrests.

Arrested Thursday and charged with several counts of burglary were Ernie Crutchfield, 21, and Jessie Garcia, 22. Crutchfield was arraigned in Farwell on Thursday, and two, Randy Richards; and whistle Garcia was arraigned before J.P. Frances Euler Friday morning. Bond for each was set at \$5,000.



EMOTIONS

Now is the time for all the disorganized to come to the aid of their dishevelment. First a quiz: *Is your desk cluttered?

*Is your car dirty most of the time? *Do you forget appointments and

fail to return telephone calls? *Are you tired most of the time? *Do you lack intimacy with God?

*Do you neglect family and friends? *Are you dissatisfied with your work?

*Are you always rushing but getting nothing of value accomplished?

*Are you irritable and unhappy most of the time?

*Do you neglect your health?

Although these symptoms taken together reflect lack of organization, one or two or even three of these signs in themselves may indicate something else. We've all seen, for example, a disordered desk that bestows an aura of things getting done, a cozy clutter that offers concord without cobwebs. This organized clutter may signal energy and dedication rather than disorganization.

If, however, you've answered affirmatively to three or more, you would do well to work on getting more order into your life. Here, then, follow some suggestions for the disorganized:

ORDER. One of Poor Richard's homilies says, "Let all your things have their places. Let each part of your business have its time." But, with so many things tugging on us and so many voices calling our names, it's difficult to find that balance. Just as soon as we settle down for concentrated work we inevitably get interrupted. Unplug your telephone; turn off your computer; disconnect your answering machine; refuse to respond to Fax messages; destroy your television; double-bolt your door and give your best John Wayne imitation if anyone dares to interrupt you, and you may get some order in your life, but it's doubtful.

You can, however, get fair objectives:

*Set time limits at the beginning of visits.

*Have a regular, uninterruptable quiet time sometime during the day.

*Keep your desk clear of everything except what you are working on at the moment.

*Handle every piece of paper only once. Respond to a letter when it is in front of you.

*Discard low priority paper work.

DELAY GRATIFICATION. Getting our "ought to's" done efficiently allows more time for our "like to's." May I suggest this year you make a habit of doing the most important things first. You'll get more done, have more fun, and find more free time if you will.

KEEP YOUR COMMIT-MENTS. What is your number one resolution for this new year? Write it down. Tell it to everyone you encounter. Set yourself on the path of change--discarding bad habits and establishing good ones.

INDUSTRY. Another of Poor Richard's aphorisms suggests, "Lose no time. Be always employed in something useful. Cut off all unnecessary actions." As Shakespeare tells us in Sonnet 30, unseized time flows toward waste. When to the sessions of sweet silent thought I summon up remembrance of things past, I sigh the lack of many a thing I sought, and with old woes new, wail my dear time's waste."

TAKE TIME TO REST. Jesus Christ knew his mission, but he also understood his own limits. He took time to rest. Setting aside time for restoration may be the most effective way of returning order to our lives.

Those of us who fail to use our time wisely allow dominant people to decide how we are going to use ours. We allow other people to tell us what we are going to do. If we don't protect our allotment of time, no one else will.


BARROW CHAMP...Cammy Hancock and her father Tommy pose with the Grand Champion barrow from the 1990 County Show.






