"Carol,

Concerning your problem with the word "snuck", I don't intend to be critical of your ability as a journalist, newsperson, etc. You do good work. I don't intend to question your dictionary since it is probably correct as far as it goes. However, I have come across the word "snuck" more than once recently and if it isn't disproven then it will become a part of the next dictionary you purchase in the future.

The word seems to have been coined very recently in the country of Uzbek, S.S.R., whose capitol is Tashkent and adjoins Afghanistan on the south. A peasant farmer, Paviodar Izsnuckcovsk, wanted to carry his produce into Afghanistan to sell, mainly yak butter and large homemade sausages, in order to support his large family in Uzbek.

This trade across the border was strictly banned by the Soviet guards and KGB Secret Soviet Police.

Paviodar became so adept at evading the guards and KGB that he gained recognition and some rural fame as a smuggler. The KGB knew of him only as "snuck", the middle syllable of his full name, used among his associates to conceal his real identity, which the KGB never did connect to the full name of

Izsnuckcovsk. Since his was the business of

being sneaky and avoiding the border guards, this became known as "doing a snuck" or being successful at sneaking, hence the relation of the words sneak, sneaked, "snuck". This was according to the travel brochure from Uzbek where we decided not to go anyway.




an unexpected Due to enrollment increase, the Friona school system plans to make its second attendance check of the school year, according to Superintendent Hal Ratcliff.

Old Buda Bank at 312 Main in downtown Buda was originally known as the Farmers National Bank. It has a history of bank robberies dating to 1926. A 22-year-old college student, posing as a newspaper reporter, pulled a .32 automatic on the cashier and left for Austin with \$1,000 in her purse. The bank was sold in 1927 to the Austin National Bank and was again robbed by a lone gunman who got away with \$1,200. Shortly thereafter, Austin National Bank closed the Buda bank for good. According to local legend, Bonnie & Clyde also robbed the bank. But Barrow didn't meet Bonnie until 1930 - three years after the bank had closed.
