"Jack" Little. assistant director and acting chief of the Texas Old Age Assistance Commission, as he declared that the pension board had passed into the second phase of its work. <br> "We have completed every investigution of every application in 18 of the 20 districts. Only 4000 had not yet been investigated last week and these were in the Houston and Texarkana districts.
