

This will render the sheepman largely independent of the ruscully combinations of eastern manufacturers, who can easily form rings that control the price of wool before a pound has been clipped from the sheep. This wool is of good quality, is not greasy and has this season brought 20cts in Fort Worth. There is, and has been, a largely increasing demand for a fine mutton sheep, not only in St. Louis and Chicago, but in Fort Worth and Dallas. There is a scheme on foet at present to organize a company for the purpose of shipping Texas sheep direct from Galveston to Liverpool. Some of our prominent sheepmen are interested in the plan and there is an account of the plan a men are interested in the pain and there is an agent at present working in England. This trade will demand a heavy mutton sheep, which at present the sheepmen of Tom Green are wholly unable to supply. 

The result has been to convince him that we need a sheep of some large breed, Cotswold, Shropshire or Hampshire with just enough of Merino cross to make them herd well and give the fleece fulling properties, say one third. This cross will give a us from 7 to a 10th fleece, and the wethers, fat, will weigh from fisece, and the wethers, fat, will weigh from 125 to 175lbs in the eastern markets. This will render the sheepman largely independent of the rascally combinations of eastern manufacturers, who can easily form rings that control the price of wool before a pound has been clipped from the sheep. This wool is of good quality, is not greasy and has this season brought 20cts in Fort Worth. There is, and has been a largely increasing domain and Budweise is, and has been, a largely increasing demand for a fine mutton sheep, not only in St. Louis and Chicago, but in Fort Worth and Dallas. There is a scheme on foot at present to organize a company for the purpose of shipping Texas sheep direct from Galveston to Liverpool. This trade will demand a heavy mutton sheep, which at present the sheepmen of Tom Green are wholly unable to supply. 

Here in free America the pope would be prized alone for his vote, and on being naturalized he would be regarded as any other citizen vest pulled down. The pope in America would lose his power over the people, or the republic would be declared a failure. Papacy belongs to monarchy, and it would take a dozen or more ice-machines to manufacture enough holy water to keep up a Pope's dignity in this country .- Gatesville Advance.

The Pope's position as a monarch is not at all necessary to the exercise of his authority as head of the church. Though the states of the church have been forcibly annexed to the kingdom of Italy. The ecclesiastical power of the Pope is in no degree diminished. The Pope will ever be regarded as the temporal head of the church and his decission on all questions of ecclesiastical differences as infallible. His residence in the United States would not diminish his power nor detract from the reverence in which he is held by the larger portion of the Christian world. In the United States the Pope would be free from State interference in the exercise of his spiritual sovereignty, which is all that was sought to be accomplished by the papal exercise of temporal power.
