

Hart defeated Johnson in a terrible fight, but Tommy Burns stepped in later and put Hart on the shelf. Burns in turn was tabled by Black Jack, who has held the title since that date. From every section of the country there came communications to Jeffries pleading with him to come back in the limelight and bring back the championship to the Caucasian race. For a while Big Jeff would not listen to their importunities, but finally, seeing that the desire was so widespread, he consented to come back if he could get into condition once more. From the latest information obtainable he is getting back to condition fast and when he faces the black fighter in the roped arena it will be the same old Jeff who stood undefeated for so many years, with a standing challenge to the world for all eligibles.
