GOOD ROADS.

In the mad rush to get rich quick, there have been many essential things neglected which go to make up the mest important asset of any country. One of the foremost of them is the "good road" proposition. There has been a great deal said on this subject, there is a great deal more to say. And in looking over our exchanges we fin i the story so well told that we give

"In a recent article on the cost of producing our staple farm crops you failed to refer to what is perhaps the principal reason for the high price of farm products-the deplorable condition of by far the greater mileage of our country roads. Of the entire highway system of the country more than 90 per cent is merely poorly graded dirt road, and during the greater portion of the year these roads are mud sloughs or full of ruts and holes. in spring and fall at least a million miles of these roads are almost impassable for heavy loads, and to get the heavier farm products to market requires three or four trips, instead of one trip that would be sufficlent over improved roads. means that so much more of the farmer's time must be spent in marketing his crops. This is not the only economic loss due to our bad roads. Because of their condition the farmer can not haul loads in wet weather but must wait for fine days. This result in losing valuable time that should be devoted to farm work. therefore decreases the produc tivity of the farms. In France and Germany, where over improved roads the average load drawn by one horse is 3,300 pounds as against 1,400 pounds over level dirt roads and 1,000 over hilly roads in this country, covered farm wagons are generally used and rainy days are largely chosen for going to market. The farmer suffers from bad roads not only in getting his crops to the nearest town or railway station, but also in the increased cost of hauling home the heavier articles he buys. such as coal, mill feed, lumbe The net results of our dirt road system is to diminish the productive capacity of our farmers while adding to the cost of their products to the cities. The whole good roads question is simey necessary for the work of con structing and maintaining improved roads. In view of the enormous loss and waste due to present conditions and the doubted advantage that would follow the establishment of a complete system of improved roads. it would seem that this great and wealthy country should be able to devote much larger amounts to scientific road building. This is not merely a farmer's problem but a matter that directly affects our manufacturing, commercial and transportation interests as well, since their prosperity in the long run depends on the economic condition of the farmers; and its solution will increase the comfort and welfare of all the people of

Nobody will dispute a single polu made in this letter, and in a special sense it applies to our Western coun There are freighters who hau from San Angelo a distance of from fifteen to one hundred miles, all the supplies and provisions required meet the demands of the people of their respective territories. And even these have neglected the impr of their roads. The ueople of the re spective countles fail to attend to it merchants of San Angelo have failed to see that the roads over which their customers have to travel are in good condition. It is true that at this time there can be no objection raised, but we do not expect the con ditions of affairs to remain as they are long. Talk about good Get everybody interested in good roads. Your property will increase five per cent in value if you see to it that there is a good road leading to it. Now all together, one continuous hard pull for better roads.


